You may recall that on December 20th, 1968, I spoke to you on the telephone concerning the matter you raised in the House on November 13th on the matter of Unidentified Flying Objects, in particular the sighting by Steve Michalak.

As a researcher in this field for over twenty years, and also as the author of a serious book on the subject, I am particularly interested in this case. I thought that you may be interested in reading what I have had to say on this matter as it may shed some light on why governments are often so reluctant to give out information on this particular subject.

My book is titled "Science, the Public and the UFO" and a copy is held in the Parliamentary Library, if you find time to refer to it. I have enclosed a dust jacket to give you some idea of the type of book that it is, and also so that you may see that it is not the "crackpot" type of book which is often published on this subject.

I think it will also interest you to know that I have viewed the particular file on Michalak, at the National Research Council.
