

I don't see how having a Canadian group will in itself make a difference when it comes to duplication of research activity. The battles between NICAP and APRO, not to mention the hundreds of other US groups, are legend. MUFON itself was in part set up by people who were upset by APRO and its practical policies. The unnecessary duplication of effort here in Canada just mirrors the duplication in the US. One of the reasons that I wish Canadian researchers get together is to avoid this hangup. This could be done informally or formally; but it needs to be done, and is in fact hampered by the existing UFO organizations in my view.
