The Canadian Aerial Phenomena Research Organization, (now affiliated with The Aerial Phenomena Research Organization of Tucson, Arizona, U. S. A.) is a non-profit civilian study group concerned with the scientific study of U. A. O.'s. Membership in the organization is open to all persons interested in the investigation and study of this phenomenon. Our purpose is mainly to gather data to be made available for scientific study. While CAPRO has not drawn any conclusions as to the source of U. A. O.'s, we do include, among other possibilities, that they are of extra-terrestrial origin.

It is desirable that all members participate in objective investigations when the opportunity presents itself. It is important that members be open-minded, considering in depth all reports received, regardless of how preposterous or insignificant they seem to be at the time. Outlined below are important guidelines that should be followed when interviewing witnesses.

- (1) Conduct interviews when at least two CAPRO representatives are present.
- (2) Conduct individual interviews with persons witnessing the same sighting.
- (3) Endeavour to interview witnesses on two occasions if possible.
- (4) Utilize a tape recorder for interviews if possible or if a recorder is not available, use CAPRO questionnaire supplied to all members.
- (5) Establish a respectable relationship with observer.
- (6) Check to see whether or not the witness is willing to release his name in the event of publication or wishes to remain anonymous.

- (8) Do not endeavour to draw conclusions or lead the witness during the interview.
