The ten subcommittees serve specifically as advisory panels to the Chairman of the Committee and to the Section Heads. From an administrative standpoint, however, they are independent of the Sections.

The purpose of subcommittees is to provide assistance to the various sections to which they are directly related and coordination or liaison with other sections where activities or interests overlap. (For example, the Membership Committee actually assists only the Administrative Section, whereas the Policy and Steering Subcommittee may assist all Sections in one way or another.)

Subcommittee members normally serve without compensation although, under certain circumstances, exceptions may be authorized. Nominal reimbursement for expenses in attending meetings or for special services is permissible.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Nine in number, elected by the membership at the first members' meeting each year. Governors elect their Speaker.

(This body is equivalent to the Board of Directors of a corporation for profit.)

Members of the Board of Governors serve without compensation. Nominal reimbursement for expenses in attending meetings is permissible.
