

1978. U.S. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE. (NASA Information Sheet, Febr. 1, 1978):

"Reports of unidentified objects entering United States air space are of interest to the military as a regular part of defense surveillance."

1984. MINISTRY OF DEFENCE, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Island. (Confirmation of ICUFON UFO Memorandum, Sep. 4, 1984):

"I should first of all point out that the sole interest of the Ministry of Defence is reported sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) is to establish whether they have any bearing on the defence of the country."

Would you rather convince yourself by the delusive theories of the community of space scientists, and the deceptive treatment of UFOs by the media--and repudiate your highest military authorities dutiful warnings as "blatant lies"....?

Classic Dog-Fights Incidents:

1942. General GEORGE C. MARSHALL, Chief of Staff declassified Memorandum on February, 26, 1942, to President F.D. Roosevelt on the "mysterious air alarm" over Los Angeles: (exerpts):

"...As many as fifteen airplanes may have been involved...flying 'very slow' at elevation from 9-18000 feet, The 37th CA Brigade (AA) expended 1430 rounds of ammunition" "...No planes were shot down, No bombs were dropped."

1952. Capt. EDWARD J. RUPPELT, Head of the US AF Project Bluebook. (His book: The Report on UFOs, page # 1):

"In the summer of 1952 a United States Air Force F-86 jet interceptor shot at a flying saucer. - This fact, like so many others that make up the full flying saucer story, has never been told."

1955. General BENJAMIN W. CHIDLAW, in charge of U.S. Continental Air Defense Command, at Ent AFB, Colorado Springs, Colo., in a 1955 interview:

"We have stacks of reports about flying saucers. We take them seriously when you consider we have lost many men and planes trying to intercept them."

1967. Air Marshal ROESHIN NURJADIN, Comdr, in Chief Indonesian Air Force, in a confirmative letter on the UFO activity. (May 5, 1967):

"UFOs sighted in Indonesia are identical with those sighted in other countries. Sometime they pose a problem for our air defence and once we were obliged to open fire on them."

1976. EMBASSY OF UNITED STATES IN IRAN. "Teheran, Iran. Sep. 20, 1976, CONFIDENTIAL" (Teletype to Washington DC.):

(Excerpt) "...This second object headed straight toward the F-1 at a very fast rate of speed. The pilot attempted to fire an AIM-9 missile at the object but at that instant his weapons control panel went off and he lost all communications (UHF and interphone)."

1980. U.S. JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF, Message Center, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, June 3, 1980:

(Excerpt) "...a UFO was spotted two different occasions near Peruvian air force (FAP) base in southern Peru. The FAP tried to intercept and destroy the UFO, but without success."
