MIKHAIL GORBACHEV'S ADDRESS

on February 16, 1987, in the Grand Kremlin Palace, Moscow, before the Gala Meeting of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union.

Five hours confidential talk with U.S. President Ronald REAGAN in Geneva Summit (Nov. 18-20, 1985), -- concerning the threat by extraterrestrial - UFO - Forces global operations.

The opening remarks were made by Academician Yevgeni Velikhov, chairman of the Committee of Soviet Scientists for Peace and Against the Threat of Nuclear War. He was followed by a number of speakers who represented several professional groups that had discussed issues of interest in their private sessions. The speakers included Professor Bernard Lown (USA)—for the group of medical doctors and scientists; Professor Frank von Hippel (USA)—for natural scientists; Rinaldo Ossola (Italy), president of the Italo-Soviet Chamber of Commerce—for the business community; Egon Bahr (Federal Republic of Germany), director of the Institute of Security—for political scientists; Metropolitan Paulos Mar Gregorios (India)—for the religious community; Graham Greene (Great Britain), writer—for cultural and art personalities; General Michael Harbottle (Great Britain), administrator for the Western group of the movement "Generals for Peace and Disarmament"—for the movement; and Veselin Neikov (Bulgaria), editor of the magazine *Nature Protection*—on behalf of the conference "Ecologists for Peace."

Then Mikhail Gorbachev addressed the forum participants. The text of his address begins on the next page.

7A serves part of an international community. The worries of all humankind are our worries, its pain is our pain, and its hopes are our hopes.

In spite of all the differences between us, we must all learn to preserve our one big family of humanity.

At our meeting in Geneva, the U.S. President said that if the earth faced an invasion by extraterrestrials, the United States and the Soviet Union would join forces to repel such an invasion. I shall not dispute the hypothesis, though I think it's early yet to worry about such an intrusion. It is more important to think about the troubles that have entered our common home. It is more important to realize the need to eliminate the nuclear threat and accept that there is no roof on the earth or in space to save us if a nuclear storm breaks out.

Our idea of creating a comprehensive system of international security and our other initiatives clearly show that the Soviet Union is willing and ready to renounce its nuclear
