Dear Jim:

I am writing to fill you in on the latest developments with Steve Michalak. I am also writing to request some information to assist us here in our efforts to work with Member of Parliament Mr. E. Schreyer in our dealings with the Canadian Government.

Michalak has suffered another recurrence of the burns and leg rash however, this time it was not severe. In previous attacks you are aware of the fact that he was bed-ridden each time for a period of days. The burn and rash marks were just as pronounced but the headaches were not as severe nor was he sick to his stomach. He was able to remain on the job and today the symptoms have almost vanished completely. This attack commenced May 6th or 112 days after the third attack which took place Jan. 15, 1968. This is right on schedule and is the third time since the sighting of last May that the malady has returned. Each recurrence averages 110 to 112₁ apart.

On May 14th, I visited him and talked at great length again with Michalak and his family. I am pretty well convinced that his story is true. My impression is that Mrs. Michalak may tend to exaggerate details however I was impressed with Michalak's son Mark, an engineering student at the U. of Manitoba. I interviewed Mark on the happenings from the time Mr. Michalak arrived back in Winnipeg from Falcon Lake on the bus (Mark met him at the bus depot) right through the following weeks subsequent to the sighting. I spent about five hours interviewing Michalak and his son and Mark corroborated almost every point of the case. This is the first time we have had a chance to intensively interview the son.

During the conversation, I asked Michalak to again show me the soil samples, hat and shirt remnants. We took a piece of uranium ore the Michalak had in his rock collection and tested it with a geiger counter at X10. The piece of ore registered 10 UR on the geiger scale. (Background in the house registered 3 to 5 UR. My radium dial watch at X10 registered at 5 UR. The sample of soil taken from the centre of the sight sent the needle to the top of the scale (100 UR) at setting X10. My first question now is, what did the U. of Utah discover? Your last letter to me stated they had not completed their tests however you also mentioned that Roy Craig intimated the soil samples in their possession had been seeded with radium paint.

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
