CANADA COUNCIL GRANT TO GEORGES LETOURNEAU

Question No. 4,017—Mr. Cossitt:

With reference to the 1974-75 Annual Report of the Canada Council which lists a grant in the amount of \$6,600 to Georges Letourneau of Montreal "to investigate uses of the translation of human bio-electrical signals into musical sound" (a) what are human bio-electrical signals, (b) what were the conclusions of the investigation, (c) what are the names and addresses of all those (i) appearing on the application for the grant (ii) who recommended the grant to the Canada Council, (d) what are the reasons that the application for the grant was approved?

Miss Coline Campbell (Parliamentary Secretary to Secretary of State): I am informed by the Canada Council as follows: (a) Human bio-electrical signals are electrical impulses of the brain which can be recorded by an encephalograph. (b) Conclusions are not yet available as the investigation is still under way. (c) (i) The only name appearing on the application form is that of Georges Letourneau. (ii) See Appendix I of the Council's 18th Annual Report for the names of members of the Regional Selection Committees for the Explorations Program. To protect the privacy of candidates and Committee members, the Council does not release their addresses. (d) The Selection Committee judged the application worthy of a grant after assessing the merit of the proposed project and the applicant's ability to carry it out, and taking into account all other applications entered in the competition.
