As a layman, first let me offer my congratulations on the publishing of a much needed scientific journal. I do hope, however, that discussion will be free and open and that certain subjects will not be 'frowned upon' as has, unfortunately, been the case with certain other noted journals.

The subject of Unidentified Flying Objects, although scoffed at by a high percentage of the scientific fraternity, is nevertheless the centre of several scientific investigations at the moment, and therefore must be of scientific interest. Your readers should, if they are indeed open-minded, be interested in the fact that the first Canadian book on the study of this phenomenon, titled SCIENCE, THE PUBLIC AND THE UFO, of which I am the author, was published in December, 1967.

This work is a philosophical study of the scientific approach to the investigation of this puzzling phenomenon and it sheds light on why investigations have revealed little or nothing of the true nature of UFOs to date.
