Writing in the short period that the Soviet Government allowed open collection and discussion of UFO reports, Dr. Zigel presents some accounts of sightings, a diagnosis of the Tungusky blast and a plea for international cooperation.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT UFOs from Cincinnati Horizons by J. Allen Hynek (1975, 7 pages).

Based on a speech by Dr. Hynek, this is a general discussion of the subject, with photos of IFOs, daylight discs, nocturnal lights, a physical trace, and a witness' sketch.

THE ZETA RETICULI INCIDENT from Astronomy Magazine by Terence Dickinson (1976, 31 pp).

A beautifully color-illustrated reprint of an article describing Marjorie Fish's interpretation of the star map allegedly seen by Betty Hill inside a spaceship. The reprint includes commentary pro and con the interpretation by Fish, Kretsch, Peck, Sagan, Saunders, Schaeffer, and Soter.

SPECIAL REPORT OF THE USAF SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY BOARD AD HOC COMMITTEE TO REVIEW PROJECT "BLUE BOOK" (1966, 15 pages) [O'Brien Report]

This report was prepared prior to the hearings of the Armed Services Committee Investigating UFOs, and became a part of those hearings. Among the recommendations was the negotiation of university contracts to provide scientific investigation of selected sightings, and the designation of AFSC base personnel to work with such investigators.
