Dear Grant:

Thank you for the further letter and package of info. Very much appreciated. As I said on the phone when you called, I had written to Stan Friedman for a copy of his MUFON paper. I have now received that, plus a few extra things he sent along, all of which you must have already, as there was nothing exciting.

Yes, I was aware of Steinman's forthcoming book, and have it on order. Also have on order Timothy Good's new book "Above Top Secret -- The Word-Wide Coverup".

I agree that the MJ-12 situation is confusing, but it appears to me to be more a case of an attempt to cover up the truth now that it is out. I could be wrong. I have, for example, suspected for many years that Klass is paid by the U.S. government to debunk UFOs. Now that we know what we appear to know about Menzel, my belief holds some water.

I have now managed to get to the Public Archives re C.J. Mackenzie/Bush, and have read the relevant portion of Mackenzie's diaries. Nothing there at all. I read the whole of 1950 and through the first half of 1951. No mention of Smith, UFOs or anything related.

However, Mackenzie and Solandt did attend a "seminar" conducted by the Research and Development Board in Washington, D.C., on April 25, 1951, but no mention of UFOs. On April 23, 1951, CJM met with Bush in Washington, with Solandt, but no reference made to tops of discussion.

The R & D Board seminar was attended by a large number of people and consisted of a general briefing on a variety of topics, but "little that I was not familiar with in 1940 and it seemed a terrible waste of time to bring people who are or should be busy many miles for such a general briefing," according to CJM.
