



Information On CUFOREN

All groups and individuals wishing to participate in the Canadian UFO Report Exchange Network will follow the below terms:

(1) Every organization, individual or group voluntarily prepares a summary (to be mailed the first of every month) of all the UFO reports they received or obtained during that month in Canada and also their own research and investigative results on those cases.

(2) When you join CUFOREN, you will be given a listing of all other organizations and individuals whom you will mail monthly xerox copies to, and also have correspondence if you wish.

(3) The only cost would be that of the copies and postage for mailing. NOTE: Groups wishing to participate in CUFOREN, but a copier is unavailable to them, should write Project S.U.M. for special considerations.

(4) Reports that you have already placed in other publications should still be included in your summary report.

(5) Summaries should be no more than a page in length or less (unless the information warrants a more lengthy summary) and should include the following data in this order:

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| a) Date | d) Data on witness (Occupation, name, etc.) |
| b) Time, Duration | e) Results of investigations & conclusions |
| c) Accurate description of appearance, movements, physical effects in area | |

(6) A notice will be mailed to major UFO publications listing all names and addresses of the participants in the network, once an acceptable number of groups and individuals have been obtained. Also, notices will possibly be sent concerning the progress of CUFOREN.

Many organizations sometimes only receive a couple of reports in one month, so do not hesitate to participate in CUFOREN simply because some months you only receive one or two reports, every bit helps.

If, for example, there are 10 participants other than you in CUFOREN, by the first of each month you will mail 10 copies of your report summaries to these organizations. At the same time, they would be mailing off 10 copies of their summaries, and by about the second week of the month, you would receive all the summaries from the others.

This method of exchange would be very beneficial if there were participants in all the Provinces, then the network would be better than any other Canadian publication in terms of reporting sightings.
