Dear Mr. Trench,

Thank you for your letter of July 10th, and for your kind invitation to write another article for Flying Saucer Review.

I have been asked many times to state my position with respect to the various aspects of Flying Saucers, and so I have prepared a document in which I set forth my views on the subject. I am enclosing a copy which you may publish if you wish. This is not exclusive as I have sent this same material to others and intend to continue to do so.

With respect to Miss Davis' article "Meet The Extraterrestrial", I must say that it does raise several significant points, but I do think that many of these points are covered in my write-up; certainly from my point of view. Beyond this I can only say that Truth needs no defence. No one can create a fact by making a statement nor destroy a fact by denying it, and those who search for Truth are interested in the facts themselves rather than statements made respecting them.

In my opinion, one of the strong points in favour of the validity of the contacts with extraterrestrials is the fact that through them we have been made aware of a simple, yet elegant philosophy, which is self consistent and transcends ours by a tremendous margin; and so far as I have been able to determine is possible of confirmation by experimental means available to us.

Certainly there are discrepancies. I would expect some, and would be very suspicious if there weren't any. Descriptions of this earth and our philosophy TO extraterrestrials would no doubt give rise to wide discrepancies since we know from bitter experience that there would be as many differing descriptions as there were people describing. Try an experiment along this line sometime!

I have seen many articles on gravitation some of which contain information which I am reasonably sure came from "outside", but they all have a failing in common. From the point of view of our science they are just so much double talk. Behind these articles lies a glimmer of truth and understanding but it certainly is not expressed in a manner which will enable we people of earth to understand it. 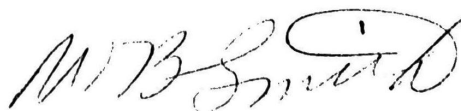
I am replying to your most interesting letter of April 13, and note that you hope to be in Ottawa for our May meeting of the Ottawa Flying Saucer Club, which is scheduled for May 12.

Unfortunately, I shall be in Montreal attending the Maritime Radio Technical Commission Conference which runs for the 11th and 12. I would duck it but I am chairman for the afternoon session of the 12. However, my absence need not deter you from coming to Ottawa, as the meeting will go just as well without me, and I am sure the membership would be most pleased to hear from you. Maybe we could help in your work.

With respect to the Binding Force Meter, this is a very simple gadget. It consists of a nylon fiber (5 lb. fish line) stressed to about 4 lbs, pulling against a spring which is capable of holding at least 10 lbs. The fiber is wound once around a spindle (short length of darning needle) which carries a pointer which moves over a scale (Yaxley radio dial plate 0-10). The fiber is wound so that any tendency for it to lengthen moves the pointer towards the smaller numbers. ANY convenient mounting can be used although the one shown in the attached clipping we have found very good. Regions of reduced binding show about 1 to 3 scale number differences.

I shall be looking forward to seeing you in the near future even if we miss on the 12th. In any case a letter is much appreciated, even though I am disgracefully slow in answering.

Dear Mr. Fulton.

Thank you for your kind letter of July 19, and also for the copies of your bulletin. Yes, I have a copy of "The Truth About Flying Saucers", and I enjoyed reading it very much.

With reference to Plantier's theory it is quite surprising how close to fact his speculation really is. However, he did not press his conclusions to their logical conclusion because if he had he would have been able to explain the remaining features of the UFO sightings. Plantier merely postulated somekind of a force field and drew his conclusions therefrom, with amazing accuracy.

I am truly sorry that I cannot pass on to you or your group at this time, the information that I have with regard to such force fields. You see, there are several of us who are entrusted with portions of this advanced technology, none with enough to make real use of. The idea is that as and when the world becomes sane, this technology will be placed at their disposal. We are specifically prevented from any interchange of information or any premature dissemination of it. We are given this information as evidence of the good faith of the saucer people, and as proof to our individual satisfaction that they are what they say they are. He does "color up" his presentations but fortunately not at the expense of accuracy, as I have yet to catch him in a mis-statement.

With respect to coming events, I expect a substantial increase in sightings within the next few monts, accompanied by a number of upsets of various kinds. Just how severe will be these upsets

disturbances, but this is one of their main reasons for being here.

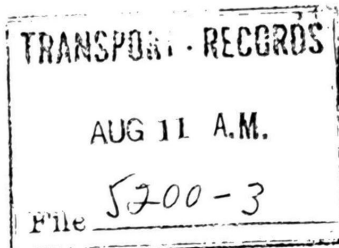

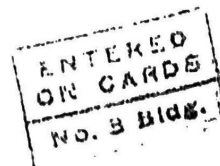
This letter may be impertinent, but I would appreciate hearing from you and learn whether you substantiate within reason the statements made by Major Keyhoe.

I am sorry that I have been so long in answering your letter of August 9th, but I have been quite busy lately with my office work generally.

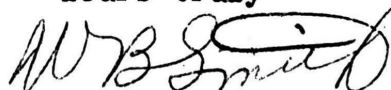
As you may have heard the Government decided to drop all further official investigation of the flying saucer phenomenon, but I am carrying on with the work as a purely private project. There were a number of reasons behind this decision which I can't go into, but they did not include lack of results.

With reference to Major Keyhoe's book and the references therein to our work, I must say that the statements are substantially correct. You will note that the line of speculation which he features is based entirely on the supposition that a 'magnetic sink' can be established. The rest follows directly. The only trouble is that we have so far found no way to make such a sink.

I am personally convinced that the saucers are real, that they are operated by intelligences more advanced than we are, that they are not hostile, and that they would associate with us if they could be convinced that we were not savages at heart.

We are gradually learning a good deal from our studies, but we feel that it is quite premature to make any disclosures as to what we have found out. We hope that we will be in a more favorable position in the not too distant future.

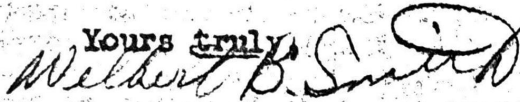

Dear Mr. Stewart,

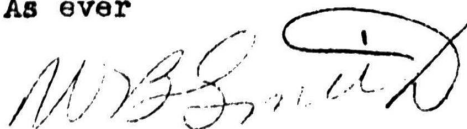
I am so very sorry that I was unable to meet you in Toronto, but it seemed as if there was a conspiracy to keep me home during that period. I do hope that we can get together some time in the not too distant future. I did get to Toronto about a week after you had gone back to Vancouver, but it was only for a day, and quite out of phase with your visit.

I have been very busy lately with a number of outside activities which I managed to get myself involved in, so that I have not been able to spend as much time on this project as I would like. However, I am still operating the gravimeter as a means for checking time field fluctuations. There were a couple last month, and a few days ago when the Russians set off their Big Blast, there was such a strong gravity wave from it that it broke the delicate quartz spring in the instrument! However, I suppose that if sufficient small steps are made some of the distance may be covered.

Dear Mr. Clark,

Thank you for your kind letter of September 25, and your comments with respect to the tapes.

While I cannot vouch for the authenticity of these tapes I think that they are probably substantially correct. At least the information contained therein checks quite well with similar information obtained through other sources.

Insofar as the "tensor" beam is concerned, I am aware of the technology on which it is based, and it is sound. I have played with it but so far have been quite unable to manage it.

I am not in a position to comment on the termination of the activities of the Los Angeles group beyond the fact that there was some difficulty involving one of the members. However, I do not think that this in any way affected the validity of the tapes.

With regard to the November prediction I can only comment, "wait and see." I do not at the present have any other contact with this particular group of space people except through the California contact, so I cannot check very well. I hope to be able to locate another contact but this hasn't yet become a reality. Apparently, there are quite a few groups of space people operating in the vicinity of this planet, and while they have knowledge of each other they do not engage in extensive interchange of ideas. Some of them are working for the benefit of the human race, others to fulfil a "plan", and still others are merely "tourists". Something drastic is due to happen here shortly and I suppose it is natural that people would flock here to observe it.

I am sorry that I can't be more specific but I really don't have too much to go on. My efforts have been directed along somewhat different lines. However, in this day and age just about anything can happen, and usually does!

I was most interested to get your letter stating your interest in flying saucers.

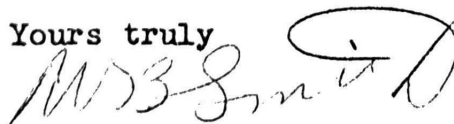
For about 4 years I was in charge of a Canadian government project for studying this phenomenon and we collected a large number of sighting reports and did quite a bit of work in their analysis. While we did establish the reality of the phenomenon we were unable to establish causes. Our analysis showed that there was about a 90% probability that the objects were real and about 60% that they were alien vehicles.

After about four years of work we reached the stage that further investigation was largely repetitive and we turned up very little new data. Even small scale measurements were not conclusive. The government took the position that with the inconclusive data which we had been able to gather a large scale investigation was not warranted, and continuation with the small scale activities was not likely to produce any further conclusions beyond those we had already reached. Consequently the project was officially dropped.

I have been carrying on the investigation as a private venture, with the help of several other people who are not satisfied to let the matter drop, and I think we may get results eventually. I am convinced that the probability of the objects being alien vehicles is sufficient to warrant at least a try on our part to uncover any technology which may be behind them.

I would suggest that anyone who wishes to make a serious study of saucers make a point of following up EVERY lead, however slight, as I have found that some of the most inconspicuous leads produced the most satisfying results. By all means don't be discouraged by the levity with which this work is received as we have had to contend with this factor every inch of the way.

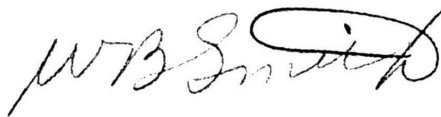

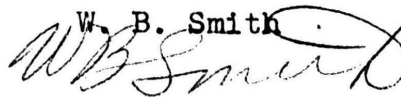

Dear Mr. Stewart,

Many thanks for your long and informative letter, and the pictures. I can see that you are quite well equipped, and with a little patience should get some results.

I have taken the liberty of giving your name and address to TELONIC RESEARCH CENTER, Prescott, Arizona, who have set up quite an establishment to study the saucer problem. They may possibly get in touch with you with some aspect with which you could help, such as triangulation to obtain distance and size of some object.

Leonard Cramp's book is very good and much to the point, and I think is correct as far as it goes. He does not however, deal with the problem of gravity, but merely states that the saucer people must have a method of 'overcomming' gravity. From our own studies we think that this is in the right direction but only a first step. The saucer people no doubt have a technology as far ahead of ours, as ours is ahead of the technology of the middle ages. What we should do is back up, take a good look in proper perspective, and take another run at it, but not over the same path! I do have the key information now but may not disseminate it yet. But I do know that any sincere attempt to find out will get right answers.

With respect to your precise position I am sure that you can get it from any of the Government offices in Vancouver. Just start at any one of them and some ten calls later you should connect with the right party. If you have any trouble just send me a road map with the spot marked on it and I shall figure out the Lats and Longs.

I can tell you something about the UFO people. They are of the same basic human stock as we. They have been civilized for a very long time. I wish to thank you very much for your great courtesey in sending me the many records of the sittings, of which I will take the best of care and return them to you shortly.

I have not yet completed my analysis but it does appear that the communicators need quite a bit of instruction as to conditions at this end of the circuit. You have probably noticed also the large amount of wordage used to convey a meaning. This is characteristic of communications from a race who use thought processes entirely among themselves.
