Dear Mr. Bray:

Thank you for your letter of May 21st, which Mrs. Cooper passed on to me to answer.

We can certainly understand the problem you speak of, although we surely had to laugh at your statement: "There must be thousands of others in a similar position". How we wish there were thousands! Our checkbook would look much healthier than it does in reality. The truth is that there are only about 70 persons who share your plight.

Your country, Canada, is the only country in the world (that we mail to) whose postal system requires that we put the Bulletin in an envelope. The rule is, as I understand it, that all mail must be enclosed on all four sides. To all others (than the Canadians) we send the Bulletin folded and stapled, with the address label right on the cover. Even our reminder statements are unacceptable in Canada, and will be returned to us if we do not enclose them in a totally sealed envelope.

Anyway, of our 70 Members in Canada (bless you all), you are the first to complain, but I suspect all have the same problem. All I can think to do is to write your renewal code on the cover of your Bulletin before the next mailing. I'll make a memo to myself to that effect.
