"Then I wrote to Canadian ~~Premier~~ Pierre Trudeau pointing this out.

"The reply I received from the Department of External Affairs said, ^{the} ~~this~~ *prospects for the adoption of a resolution by the General Assembly are not considered encouraging at the present time* ~~was not possible~~, but that the Canadian Government was keeping the

question of UFOs under consideration and study. *If and when it appears that a resolution of this kind would be likely to receive approval by the General Assembly, the Canadian Government would be prepared to take all necessary steps in this connection, the department stated.*

"However, I have not been able to find out what that 'study' is--and I am not aware of any studies being carried out," he added.

"Russia might not share this knowledge with the rest of the world, but use it to further her own ends alone.

"This possibility ~~alone~~ ^{in itself} is sufficient justification for all nations to work together to solve the UFO mystery and share the benefits equally," Bray said.

But so far his own government continues to refuse to place his proposal on the UN General Assembly agenda, he pointed out.
