Dear Sirs

I would like to know where I could obtain the following information. The Canadian Government in the early fifties started research into the field of discoid propelled by some form of electrical field. I don't know the name of the investigating body but it was headed by William B. Smith of Ottawa B.A.Sc., M.Sc., in or around 1953 it was supposed to abandon this investigation due to lack of knowledge and go into intensive study of the UFO'S observed at the time. Mr. Smith was supposed to be Superintendent Radio Regulations Engineering for the government. I presume that because of Mr Smith's title the body doing the investigation might have come under the DOT radio branch. What I would like is a copy of the report made to the government at that time.

Also in November 1961 this Mr. Smith was quoted as saying that the government research team had recovered a mass of metal of about 10,000 lbs weight. The metal was supposed to have been found on 1 July 60, where it was found I don't know but Mr. Smith stated that it was from outer space. What I would like to know where was the metal found? Does it still exist? Could the analysis of the material be read or a copy sent to myself? Is it possible to obtain a sample?

Your letter of July 30 has been forwarded to me by the Department of Transport.

Wilbert B. Smith carried out a number of semi-official investigations while he was alive but as far as I know he left relatively few written records. We have here a copy of one report by W.B. Smith entitled "Project Magnet Report". In this report he takes 25 sightings of unidentified objects in the sky and uses these to develop a system of assessing the reliability of individual reports and a suggested method of cataloguing and analysis. This report is available for reference in our office as are numerous reports of U.F.O's which we file and catalogue. I do not think that the report I have referred to is what you are looking for and I am sorry to say that we do not have the facilities for distributing copies of material from our files.

Dear Mr. Williamson:

I wish to thank you for your reply of May 7th instant re our organization. My thanks also, for your correction of information we had always held to be true.

Our principal aim in requesting with the Minister of Transport (then Mr. Hellyer, now his successor), was to engage your department's aid, as you set forth in paragraph three of your letter. On a number of occasions, objects have been seen in the sky, both in daylight, and at nighttime. It HAD been my practice to call both Montreal International Airport at Dorval, P.Q., and the St. Hubert Air Base at St. Hubert, P.Q. (hence the request for the Minister's of Defence presence) for identification. On two occasions, I have asked:

- 1) Have you sent up any meteorological balloons within the past six hours?
- 2) Do you have on your radar-scope, any balloons from any other locations?
- 3) Are there any satellites passing above the general area at the present time?

On both occasions, replies were as follows:

- 1) I do not know.
- 2) I do not know, call other surrounding weather stations.
- 3) I do not know.

It so happened that on one occasion I did call other stations, and found that the base at Valcartier P.Q. had indeed sent up a balloon, yet neither of the aforementioned bases knew of the event. Therefore, what we would like, one air base in the Montreal vicinity, (either civilian or military) informed by all bases of balloons which might, or would be, passing over the Montreal area. Actually, we would like to see this happen for all of Canada, but realize that time and expense would be prohibitive.

You also mentioned in paragraph six of your letter, that your department might be able to assist us within your budget. At present, we are attempting to "pay our own way" without outside monetary assistance. However, would it be possible to purchase, DIRECTLY FROM THE GOVERNMENT, at token cost:

- 1) a four-wheel drive covered jeep.
- 2) a magnetometer of good quality,
- and
- 3) a highly sensitive geiger counter.

I hope that by means of this letter, you will be better able to understand the aspirations of our group, and will answer some, if not all, of the questions contained herein. I remain,

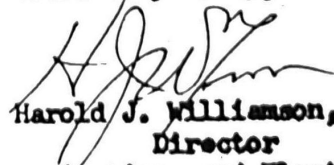
