3.) I found a copy of the interview between Friedman and Sarbacher. No need for the tape.

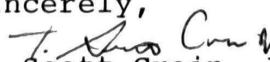

has in many traditions, such as the Greek, been preceded by the eating or drinking of a bitter substance that induces amnesia—the ancient Greeks called it “the milk of forgetfulness.”

I was made to eat a bitter fruit just before leaving that strange, lost land. Before I returned home during my abduction of December 26, 1985, I was forced to swallow a milky substance that left a horrid taste in my mouth. On May 20, 1950, a French woman was abducted. Shortly before being returned she experienced a “sickening, metallic, bitter taste . . .”

Were these drugs that made us forget? And if so, then what is the drug that induces the voyage to Magonia? Is it a powerful hallucinogen, or something that acclimatizes the body so that it can slip across space-time to another world?

I had to live with the fire of the question inside me. My mind drifted back to that tumbledown university on a desert cliff so far away. Across many summer nights my mind retreated, to the light of other skies. I will never forget the moment I entered that door and saw the glow of that distant sun falling across the floor. I remember the dust rising from my footfalls in that sacred and mysterious place. Was I in an annex to the golden city, some ancient corner where the very light shines with truth?

Was it really so far away, or is that place part of the memory and heart of every human being?

Secret Knowledge

I recognized that I was going to have to face an unpleasant reality. No matter how hard I tried, I was never going to be able to sort out my past. It seemed as if I had indeed led a double life. But I could never know the details.

What is hideous about this is that I have always thought I had a very reliable memory. It has been one of my most useful tools. Books like *Warday* are based on detailed and meticulous research committed to memory and then woven into the fictional narrative. I have always felt profoundly *in control* of my understanding of who I am and where I come from.

I am not the only mystery walking this earth. Every one of us is a mystery. We do not really know who we are, not one of us. Every past is full of contradictions. Still, I was avid with curiosity, and I kept feeling that there must be some small, perfect breakthrough that would open the fortress of remembrance. But the breakthrough did not come.

I returned to the present, sadly conceding yesterday to its own devices. In any case, there was another important field of endeavor, that of the memories that began with October 1985. I had them well organized. In January 1986, when I realized that what was happening could be important, I began to keep a detailed daily journal.

Ironically, just when I had given up on the past, the present proceeded to give me a fascinating possible insight into the events of 1968.

In early August 1986 an unusual houseguest arrived at our cabin. Unfortunately, I was asked to disguise this person's identity. This noted documentary filmmaker came to visit us in the company of a mutual friend. We had a small

houseparty: the filmmaker and his friend; Dr. John Gliedman, and our family.

The filmmaker had been in the area, heard from the friend of my experiences, and wanted to meet to compare notes. At his request, he remains anonymous.

In the early eighties the filmmaker had a very unusual encounter with a man who identified himself as a member of the air force. Their meeting was held at an air-force base in connection with a documentary the filmmaker was preparing. He was allowed to read a briefing paper concerning crashed disks and retrieval of the bodies of nonhuman beings. The filmmaker was specifically informed that he was being shown this paper at the direction of superior officers.

The document and the agent's statements had naturally been of great interest to the filmmaker. The whole experience had left him with a lot of unsatisfied curiosity.

The typed pages which he had read were titled "Briefing Paper for the President of the United States." There was no specific president mentioned, and he didn't remember a specific date. He was not allowed to take notes on the spot, but he recorded his recollections later in detail. The controversial document surfaced in 1987, and the filmmaker's memory proved to be accurate.

The paper described a series of crashed UFO disks at Aztec and Roswell, New Mexico, at Kingman, Arizona, and a crash in Mexico. Nonhuman bodies had allegedly been taken from the craft and had been examined in laboratories. The creatures were described as about four feet tall, gray-skinned, and hairless, and having large heads compared to their smaller, thin bodies. Their faces were flat without ears or nose, and had a slit for a mouth. They had large eyes. Because of their skin color they were referred to as "grays."

The paper also described direct contact between government officials and a survivor of one of these crashes. This being was called Ebe, an acronym for "extraterrestrial biological entity." The officials were told that the gray beings had carried out a long-term intervention in human affairs, ma-

manipulating mankind's biological, sociocultural, and religious evolution. The being had eventually died of unknown causes.

The paper outlined the government's efforts since the 1940s to ascertain the origin, nature, and motives of the beings, and, presumably, to gain some sort of control over the situation, or at least some insight into it.

The agent told the filmmaker that he was being shown the document and given the information because the government intended to release to him several thousand feet of film taken between 1947 and 1964 showing crashed disks and extraterrestrial bodies as historic footage to be placed in his documentary.

He never received the footage. Had he been shown a real document, or was he the victim of some sort of complicated disinformation scheme? When the promised footage didn't materialize, the company he was working for became disillusioned and dropped its plans for the documentary, which he believes was the real outcome desired by the air force.

Over the years he did more investigation. He came to my house to find out if there were correlations between what I knew about the visitors from personal experience and what he had read in the alleged briefing paper and been told by the agent and other sources.

When I first started grappling with the visitor experience, I would have dismissed a story like this out of hand. Crashed disks? Government cover-up? Plain nonsense. But I have run across some information that strongly suggests otherwise. In *Communion* I reported that a prominent scientist and defense consultant, Dr. Robert Sauerbacher, had written a letter to a UFO researcher that said, among other things, "materials reported to have come from flying saucer crashes were extremely light and very tough." He went on to say, "I still do not know why the high order of classification has been given. . . ." Dr. Sauerbacher died in 1986 after a long and distinguished career. He was the author of a dictionary of electronics and engineering that is considered a fundamental contribution to science; a consultant for the

navy, the air force and the Defense Department; the former dean of the graduate school of the Georgia Institute of Technology; and a director of the General Sciences Corporation.

The filmmaker had also heard this story, and knew some of the people who had met Dr. Sauerbacher. One of these was Stanton Friedman, a noted UFO researcher. I got in touch with Mr. Friedman in the fall of 1987.

He directed me to some extraordinary information collected by himself and researcher William Moore about an event that seems to have taken place in Roswell, New Mexico, on July 2, 1947. The air force originally announced that a flying disk had crashed on a ranch near that town, and that it had been collected by a Major Jesse Marcel, a crack intelligence officer attached at that time to the 509th Bomber Group, the world's only atomic bomber wing.

Major Marcel had in 1979 contributed a videotaped statement to a documentary entitled *Flying Saucers Are Real*. In his statement, the major was absolutely unequivocal. "One thing I was certain of," he said, "being familiar with all air activities, was that it was not a weather balloon, not an aircraft, or a missile. . . . A lot of the little members had little symbols which we were calling hieroglyphics because they couldn't be read. . . . It [the metal] was not any thicker than the tinfoil in a pack of cigarettes, yet when I tried to bend it, it would not bend. . . ." Major Marcel added, "The reason that this story has remained hidden from the public for over thirty years is that General Rainey released a cover story at that point." (The general claimed that the debris had been identified as coming from a crashed weather balloon.) The major's statement was made after he had retired from the air force with an honorable discharge a few years before he died.

Also through Mr. Friedman I met Major Marcel's son, Dr. Jesse Marcel. He has a successful medical practice in a western state. Dr. Marcel remembered the crashed-disk incident vividly. He was eleven years old at the time. One day his father brought home some unusual little I-shaped

objects. They were very light and were covered with strange violet symbols. Major Marcel explained to his son that they were from a flying disk.

Friedman and Moore have documented interviews with dozens of people connected with the incident that took place at Roswell. Many of these people were direct firsthand witnesses. The two researchers have all but proved their case, and yet the press remains highly skeptical.

I believe that I discovered why this is. *The New York Times* reported on February 28, 1960, that Admiral Roscoe Hillenkoetter, the former director of Central Intelligence, had said, "Through official secrecy and ridicule, many citizens are led to believe that the unknown flying objects are nonsense." He continued, "To hide the facts, the Air Force has silenced its personnel."

Given "official secrecy and ridicule," the press has been put in a hopeless position. Who are they to believe, ordinary citizens with wild stories or government officials and highly educated scientists?

More than that, I suspect that the government *itself* may be in a position at least as difficult. CIA Director Hillenkoetter actually joined a UFO organization, the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena (NICAP). He resigned from this committee in 1962, saying that he believed the air force had done all it could and the only alternative was to "wait for some action by the UFOs."

Whether or not the visitors somehow compelled the United States government to keep their secret, the fact remains that they themselves could easily make their presence known at a moment's notice. But they remain hidden.

This means that the individual citizen is left alone, ignorant and entirely helpless when they appear in his home. It also means that he can, if he is able and inclined, rise to the challenge, and acquire in the process knowledge and strength that will be deeply his own, and his to keep. No ordinary social institution, no matter how well intentioned, can make such an offer.

It would seem to me that CIA Director Hillenkoetter's UFOs are taking action. And that action—fantastically—is to come into contact with us not as a society but as single individuals, and not in our ordinary state of mind but in a profoundly different state where we are at once more vulnerable and perhaps on a deep level more capable of understanding.

Both the filmmaker and I felt that the briefing paper had been some sort of trick to confuse his attempt to get at the truth, that it had been a clever mix of fact and fiction. By comparing his recollection of its contents with my own memories, we hoped to separate the truth from the lies.

He and I spent about eight hours talking together, comparing notes. Some of his information coincided with things I remembered.

He described what he had been told about the “planet” of the grays: a desert, with a glowing tan sky and adobelike buildings. This was startlingly familiar to me. My experience in 1968 had involved a place of tan skies and adobe structures. Outside the immediate area of the buildings it was a harsh, ugly desert as well. I also remembered that it never really got dark there. Because the planet of the grays was orbiting a binary star system, it also was said to be perpetually light.

I could not believe that I had actually *been* to another planet orbiting some unimaginably distant star and returned in a single summer. I could easily think, however, that I had been taken on a very realistic simulation of such a journey using a combination of hallucinogenic drugs and hypnosis. After all, my trip really began when the mysterious “nurses” placed three drops of liquid on my tongue.

We also found that some of the beings I had seen in my various experiences and the ones described in the paper were quite similar. Since *Communion* had not yet been published, the filmmaker had no idea of what I had seen. And yet he described the small, gray beings and their home perfectly, using his data from the briefing paper and other research. In

late 1987 the briefing paper itself emerged, released by researchers William Moore and Stanton Friedman. Its contents were very much as the filmmaker recalled them. The paper was declared a fraud by a number of authorities. One who took the trouble to research its authenticity was Dr. Roger W. Wescott, a recognized expert in linguistics with a very high reputation indeed. In a letter dated April 7, 1988, concerning the paper and some other documents allegedly authored by Admiral Hillenkoetter, Dr. Wescott commented: "There is no telling reason to regard any of these documents as fraudulent or to believe that they were written by anyone other than Hillenkoetter himself." He added: "This statement holds for the controversial Presidential Briefing Paper of November 18, 1952." Coming from a forensic expert in linguistics and style of Dr. Wescott's stature, this is stunning support for the authenticity of this incredible document.

According to the filmmaker's information there are two basic types of visitor. In addition to the small beings with large, black eyes there are taller ones, fair-complected and more humanoid, who generally do not induce the same sort of fear in people that the grays elicit.

I had seen these two types of visitor as well as others, including the small men in the blue uniforms I have previously discussed and the white beings who have had such a powerful transformative effect on me.

The best description of the gray beings came to me from a correspondent whose experience was unusual in that it started during the day. Although she ended up with hours of lost time, when she first saw the beings it was broad daylight and she was fully conscious.

"Two of these beings," she wrote, "looked the same and one was taller and thinner. The two short fat ones were about four to four and a half feet tall with broad faces and black enormous eyes but only a hint of where a mouth and nose might have been, almost like a pencil drawing. . . . I instinctively knew these were workers and were male. The other one was female and about five feet tall. She . . . had

 a very elongated face. Dark piercing huge eyes and once again just a hint of where a nose and mouth may have been."

After our long conversation, the filmmaker and I felt frustrated. We had, we felt, made some progress, but it was only in the direction of informed conjecture. The description above, however, is very exact, and other things about my correspondent's experience suggest strongly that it was entirely real and has been accurately reported.

As evening fell the filmmaker and I finished our conversation and went down to dinner. Since early morning it had been rainy and dense with clouds, and it was now drizzling quietly.

I was disappointed because I had wanted our guests to see the magnificent night sky at the cabin.

After dinner we were going to watch an old movie on the tape machine when I suddenly heard a voice quite clearly, like a radio near my left ear. It said, "Go outside."

I went out on the deck, and beheld a beautiful and awesome sight.

The clouds were leaving the sky, opening like the door of a great observatory. I called the others, and together we watched as the whole cloud mass slid from north to south as if being pushed by a giant ruler. This was literally like a door opening. The line of clouds was perfectly straight.

We stood there watching the stars. Later we went into the hot tub. John Gliedman, who is an amateur astronomer, observed a dim star make some odd maneuvers. It came in from the west and stopped in the constellation Lyra. After remaining for a considerable period of time near Vega it suddenly vanished. To him this was completely inexplicable.

An hour later the clouds came back. The next morning the houseguests left.

Things got very quiet at the cabin. My eagerness to learn about the visitors faded into uneasy fear. I was alone again. The visitors seemed more real to me than they ever had before.

I felt totally vulnerable.

The Terror of the Real

Two days after the guests left I decided to take action on my own behalf. There was only one logical thing to do: confront my fear.

I knew how to go about it. I just didn't want to contemplate what I had to do!

When night fell in the country the woods seemed to rise up around the house and clutch it with avid fingers. There was often a powerful feeling of presence. People would hear footsteps on our decks or porch, see lights shining in the windows, hear strange whistling noises in the sky above the cabin.

The one thing I could not imagine doing—the worst thing—was going outdoors at night. I could barely stand to go near the windows, let alone leave the house. I sweated out each night behind a wall of security devices.

I could not dispel my fear. I'd already determined that not one human soul knows a single certain thing about the visitors. Nobody. And the more knowledge an individual claimed, the more inwardly afraid he would usually turn out to be.

I couldn't get any reassurance from the visitors. I couldn't get even the breath of a promise—let alone a guarantee—that they wouldn't hurt me.

What I had to do was to challenge the whole situation—my fear and the visitors themselves. I could deliver my challenge by the simple process of going out into the woods alone in the dead of the night.

On the night of Friday, August 22, 1986, I attempted to walk out alone.

It was ten-thirty. I had purposely waited until Anne and

Dear Mr. Steinman:

I am sorry I have taken so long in answering your letters. However, I have moved my office and have had to make a number of extended trips.

To answer your last question in your letter of October 14, 1983, there is no particular reason I feel I shouldn't or couldn't answer any or all of your questions. I am delighted to answer all of them to the best of my ability.

You listed some of your questions in your letter of September 12th. I will attempt to answer them as you had listed them.

1. Relating to my own experience regarding recovered flying saucers, I had no association with any of the people involved in the recovery and have no knowledge regarding the dates of the recoveries. If I had I would send it to you.

2. Regarding verification that persons you list were involved, I can only say this:

John von Neuman was definitely involved. Dr. Vannevar Bush was definitely involved, and I think Dr. Robert Oppenheimer also.

My association with the Research and Development Board under Doctor Compton during the Eisenhower administration was rather limited so that although I had been invited to participate in several discussions associated with the reported recoveries, I could not personally attend the meetings. I am sure that they would have asked Dr. von Braun, and the others that you listed were probably asked and may or may not have attended. This is all I know for sure.

3. I did receive some official reports when I was in my office at the Pentagon but all of these were left there as at the time we were never supposed to take them out of the office.

4. I do not recall receiving any photographs such as you request so I am not in a position to answer.

5. I have to make the same reply as on No. 4.

I recall the interview with Dr. Brenner of the Canadian Embassy. I think the answers I gave him were the ones you listed. Naturally, I was more familiar with the subject matter under discussion, at that time. Actually, I would have been able to give more specific answers had I attended the meetings concerning the subject. You must understand that I took this assignment as a private contribution. We were called "dollar-a-year men." My first responsibility was the maintenance of my own business activity so that my participation was limited.

About the only thing I remember at this time is that certain materials reported to have come from flying saucer crashes were extremely light and very tough. I am sure our laboratories analyzed them very carefully.

There were reports that instruments or people operating these machines were also of very light weight, sufficient to withstand the tremendous deceleration and acceleration associated with their machinery. I remember in talking with some of the people at the office that I got the impression these "aliens" were constructed like certain insects we have observed on earth, wherein because of the low mass the inertial forces involved in operation of these instruments would be quite low.

I still do not know why the high order of classification has been given and why the denial of the existence of these devices.

I am sorry it has taken me so long to reply but I suggest you get in touch with the others who may be directly involved in this program.

Dear Mr. Cameron,

Recently, I noted several posts you made to Usenet concerning the death of Robert Sarbacher. I understand you have conducted extensive research on Sarbacher and have published a book entitled "Crashed Saucers, MJ-12, and the Government", in which you address Sarbacher's death. I have not purchased your book yet, but plan to do so in the near future, as I understand it is available through MUFON. Correct?

I have over the years, read many accounts and also have done a very small amount of research concerning Sarbacher's death, and his purported involvement and/or knowledge of the recovery of alien bodies. To date, I have never seen in print or known of any person who has endeavored to obtain a copy of Sarbacher's death certificate or has knowledge if there ever was an autopsy preformed. I was hoping you, perhaps, would be able to answer these questions, or possibly direct me to other sources. My interest is strictly personal, and not part of any ongoing research for publication.

Your assistance would be appreciated and thank you in advance for your time.
