However, as a result of our nuclear tests, a false and dangerous condition has been created in our atmosphere. At times these concentrations of radiation will gather together and, while usually invisible, under certain conditions can extract enough elements from the atmosphere to appear as "fireballs." With their finer instruments, space people are able to detect these false fireballs or pockets of radiation, visible or invisible; and when they do they intercept and disintegrate them with a higher frequency ray. This is but another of their ways of aiding us.

In the case of both the natural and artificial fireballs, when the concentration of energy becomes too intense toward the center, an explosion comparable to spontaneous combustion takes place. This explains some of the sonic booms that have been recorded when no Jet planes were in the vicinity; and also accounts for the erroneous reports of "exploding" space ships.

These fireballs have been seen and reported in several different colors; and the most frequent being green. Remember, however, space ships themselves can on occasions closely resemble a fireball when, in certain maneuvers and at certain speeds, they glow green, red, orange, white, ect. One is often mistaken for the other.
