You have performed a great service in our search for the truth about the metal and if the findings and conclusions of Messrs. Chamberland and Chipping are correct and Prof. Jonas considers the metal worthy of further investigation, it would seem that if we can get the government department interested in carrying out further tests, we may be well on the road to solving the mystery of the metal, if of course, we get the true findings of the results of such tests. Anyway, we are most grateful for your help and co-operation in this matter and shall appreciate your continued collaboration in obtaining more information from Mr. Chipping on Chamberland's test and analysis.

You will recall that in an earlier issue of Topside I stated we had written to Dr. Condon heading the group of scientists at the University of Colorado, who are undertaking a UFO investigation on behalf of the USAF, offering samples of the metal for test and analysis. After a 3-month silence, I wrote again by registered mail, asking for a reply to this offer. Yesterday I received a reply from a Dr. R. Craig in which he states: "The piece of metallic material you mentioned, since it cannot be related directly to an unidentified flying object, would not seem of sufficient value to our study to warrant further analysis by us." Considering I sent full details, including all the mysteries surrounding the tests and finding of the hardware, I consider this rather a poor reply and it is inclined to make one wonder about the genuineness of this investigation. If they are carrying out a sincere and thorough investigation, they should welcome anything which may lead to a solution of the mystery. I would therefore, appreciate your co-operation in sending me this information as soon as you can obtain it, Ron.
