if it ever was part of an old bridge? then how many thousands of tons did the bridge weigh.

While the metal was being moved by some of those interested, it slipped, falling onto a concrete floor cracking it.

There was apparently not any evidence of such a mass ever having been towed to where it was found. What methods were used to put the metal down on the boulder where it was found without causing indentations on the boulder.
