

Take President John F. Kennedy, for example. One of the stewards aboard Air Force One (Bill Holden), is reported to have asked the President on one flight, "what do you think about UFOs?" Kennedy is said to have replied, "I'd like to tell the public about the alien situation, but my hands are tied." Kennedy also shows up in a document entitled "Interplanetary Phenomenon Unit Summary," written in 1947 following the celebrated Roswell, New Mexico crash of an alien vessel (denied by the government), and describing then-congressman Kennedy as having received information on the Roswell "recovery operation." Even more intriguing is a declassified memorandum President Kennedy wrote to the CIA 10 days before his assassination in 1963. The memorandum, a "classification review of all UFO intelligence files affecting national security" discussed cooperating with the USSR for the purpose of joint space exploration program, and specifically referenced "high threat cases," presumably relating to UFOs. If Kennedy suspected alien threats to Earth from other life forms, he never told the American people about it.

1. Rothberg discussed the apparent break of subject with Kilgallen and the break up with the Kennedys. 2. Subject repeatedly called the Attorney General and complained about the way she was being ignored by the President and his brother.
3. Subject threatened to hold a press conference and would tell all.
4. Subject made reference to "bases" in Cuba and knew of the President's plan to kill Castro.
5. Subject made reference to her "diary of secrets" and what the newspapers would do with such disclosures.

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President John F. Kennedy and the UFOs

Was JFK silenced for knowing too much?

President John F. Kennedy may have had more than the usual knowledge about UFOs, according to several credible sources.

Further support for Kennedy's high-level knowledge regarding UFOs came from a former steward aboard Air Force One who told of a cryptic remark by President Kennedy.

Bill Holden, who also served as loadmaster for Air Force One, traveled with Kennedy to Europe in the summer of 1963. He said a UFO conference in Bonn, Germany, prompted a discussion of the subject aboard the President's plane one morning.



Holden said he turned to Kennedy and asked, "What do you think about UFOs, Mr. President?" He said Kennedy became quite serious and thought for a moment before replying, "I'd like to tell the public about the alien situation, but my hands are tied."

A controversial [MJ-12](#) document titled "Interplanetary Phenomenon Unit Summary," noted Kennedy's insider knowledge.

This document, apparently written soon after the crashes in New Mexico during July 1947, states, "It has become known to [CIC](#) [Counter Intelligence Corps] that some of the recovery operation was shared with Representative John F. Kennedy, Massachusetts Democrat elected to Congress in '46, Son of Joseph P. Kennedy, Commission on Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government. [Jack] Kennedy had limited duty as naval officer assigned to Naval Intelligence during the war. It is believed that information [concerning the Roswell crashes] was obtained from [a]

[concerning the Roswell crashes] was obtained from [a] source in Congress who is close to [the] Secretary for Air Force." Kennedy was the only Congressmen named who was aware of the truth of the Roswell incidents at the time.

Yet another document appears to be a memorandum written from President Kennedy to the director of the CIA regarding "Classification review of all UFO intelligence files affecting National Security." In this memo, Kennedy stated, "... I have initiated [blacked out] and have instructed [then NASA Administrator] James Webb to develop a program with the Soviet Union in joint space and lunar exploration. It would be very helpful if you would have the high threat cases reviewed with the purpose of identification of bona fide as opposed to classified CIA and USAF sources. It is important that we make a clear distinction between the knowns and unknowns in the event the Soviets try to mistake our extended cooperation as a cover for intelligence gathering of their defense and space programs." Kennedy then asked for all files on "Unknowns" to be turned over the NASA authorities and an interim report be forwarded to the White House no later than Feb. 1, 1964.

This document which clearly showed a president about to make UFO secrets available to wider circles in government and, hence, probably available to the public was dated Nov. 12, 1963, just 10 days before his Nov. 22 assassination in Dallas.

Desperately clinging to their UFO-free mindset, debunkers question this document's authenticity while an unquestionably authentic document has been found in the John F. Kennedy Library.

National Security Action Memorandum No. 271 is titled "Cooperation with the USSR in Outer Space Matters" and is addressed to the Administrator of NASA, at that time James Webb.

This signed memo does not mention UFOs specifically, nevertheless, Kennedy instructs Webb to "assume personally the initiative and central responsibility within the Government for the development of a program of substantive cooperation with the Soviet Union in the field of outer space, including the development of specific technical proposals." Kennedy added that this plan was a direct result of "my September 20 proposal for broader cooperation between the United States and the USSR in outer space, including cooperation in lunar landing programs."



This incredible document was also dated Nov. 12, 1963,

but who in 1963 would have believed that the United States and the Soviet Union would have been engaging in cooperative joint space operations? The White House log of that day showed that beginning at 2 p.m. Kennedy had lunch and then "no official appointments" but "conferred with various staff members during the afternoon." Obviously on this day, Kennedy had more than enough time to deal with space matters.

Also obvious is the fact that this apparent attempt to cooperate with the USSR ended with Kennedy's death in Dallas. On through the administration of Ronald Reagan, we were still warned against the "evil empire" and the costly Cold War continued.

Opponents to JFK became frantic over his attempts to alter the course of previous U.S. policies. According to one knowledgeable source, Kennedy played a dangerous game, "...after making it clearly evident that he was not prepared to support action against the communists in the normal sense - plans to withdraw troops from South Vietnam - plans to fracture or abolish portions of the CIA; plans for expansion to the Justice System; failure to support the Bay of Pigs [invasion]; and a desire to share some of our most sensitive secrets with the Russians and Chinese - space borne platforms, etc. . . All during a time when his popularity was growing in leaps and bounds with the American public - a President who did not enjoy majority support at his election. A very dangerous situation, leaving few methods for control beyond assassination."



This same source went on to say, "I believe John F. Kennedy was appraised of, and had access to, sufficient classified information, to have personally come to the conclusion that UFOs and therefore possible alien life-forms were possibly extant within our solar system. . . I think Kennedy

certainly came to this conclusion...and was looking to demonstrate not only mankind's ability to come together for a common goal, but to formally demonstrate we could enter and conquer space as a species. Back then, some would have seen this as either crazy (if they had no access to the material) or (if they had access) very premature and possibly dangerous."

A whole JFK issue evolved around his planned speech at the Dallas Trade Mart, the destination of his ill-fated motorcade on Nov. 22, 1963. Several researchers and some tabloids have claimed that he planned to change his scheduled talk and referred to handwritten notes, which may have included comments regarding UFOs. These notes have never been made public and so continue to be fodder for theorists.

Spurred on by such tantalizing bits of evidence, some researchers even claimed that Kennedy's assassination was to prevent him from revealing the news of extraterrestrial visitation to the public.

While this theory is certainly unproved and probably untrue, his willingness to end the Cold War and share our knowledge of outer space with our perceived enemies may have been the straw that broke the back of those within the Military-Industrial (and Intelligence) Complex. This group already thought the young president was "soft on communism" and a danger to their command and control structure.

With all the evidence now at hand, there can be little doubt that President Kennedy may have known more about UFOs than is generally believed.

Another fascinating story involved the late comedian Jackie Gleason. According to Gleason's second wife, Beverly McKittrick, he returned home visibly shaken one night in 1973. Gleason, who was known to have an avid interest in UFOs, said his friend President Richard Nixon had arranged for him to visit Homestead Air Force Base in Florida, where he viewed the remains of small alien beings under tight security. This story was confirmed by Larry Warren, who said Gleason met with him in May 1986 to hear Warren's account of a UFO experience in England. During their conversation, Gleason related the Nixon-aliens story and said the experience traumatized him for weeks. "You could tell that he was very sincere," said Warren. "He took the whole affair very seriously, and I could tell that he wanted to get the matter off his chest, and this was why he was telling me all of this." Before his death in 1987, Gleason was asked about this incident but declined to comment, a most interesting circumstance, since it was an opportunity to refute the story if it was false.

JFK, Marilyn, and the UFOs

An even more bizarre story concerned a UFO connection between President John F. Kennedy and Hollywood icon Marilyn Monroe—for years the subject of rumors linking the actress romantically with both John and Robert Kennedy.

In 1994, Los Angeles private investigator Milo Spiriglio, who wrote three books about Monroe's controversial death, obtained a poorly reproduced copy of what appeared to be a CIA report dated August 3, 1962—just two days before the actress died of a reported drug overdose. The report stated that, through a telephone wiretap, agents had listened in on a conversation between the renowned reporter Dorothy Kilgallen and a close friend in Hollywood. The friend talked about a breakup between Monroe and the Kennedys and said the actress was attending parties hosted by Hollywood's "inner

reveal "secrets" she had learned from both John and Robert Kennedy.

According to the report, these secrets included her knowledge of "bases" in Cuba—perhaps a reference to the Soviet missile sites that led to the crisis a few months later—and Kennedy's plans to kill Fidel Castro.

But the first listed "secret" was a "visit by the President at a secret air base for the purpose of inspecting things from outer space." Kilgallen did not seem shocked by this statement. In fact, according to the CIA report, she replied that she might know the source of such a visit—a crash in New Mexico in the late 1940s. She stated that in the mid-1950s, she had learned from a British government official about a secret effort to identify the origin of crashed spacecraft and dead bodies.

Spiriglio, a court-certified document expert, declined to reveal the name of the person who provided the report, saying that at least two federal agencies were investigating the matter, although no official word has been forthcoming. But he added that several ex-CIA contacts had verified the document's contents. "It appears to be a summary designed to be transferred to other agencies," commented researcher Vic Golubic, who investigated the document for more than a year and still could neither confirm nor deny its authenticity. "I have checked with many people and 50 percent say it's authentic and 50 percent say it's not. Either it's a very clever hoax or it's legitimate."

The document appeared to be signed by none other than James Angleton, former chief of CIA counterintelligence. Adding to suspicions about the document's legitimacy was a reference to Project Moon Dust and a smudgy imprint at the bottom that appeared to read "MJ-12."

However, there is some intriguing support for the notion that the story might be true. First is an article by Dorothy Kilgallen published in 1955. Under the headline "'Flying Saucer' Wreckage Assures Britons of Reality," she wrote, "I can report Sunday on a story which is positively spooky, not to mention chilling. British scientists and airmen, after examining the wreckage of one mysterious flying ship, are convinced that these strange aerial objects are not optical illusions, but are actually flying saucers which originate on another planet. The source of my information is a British official of cabinet rank who prefers to remain unidentified. 'We believe, on the basis of our inquiries thus far, that the saucers were staffed by small men—probably under four feet tall,' my informant told me. 'It's frightening but there is no denying the flying saucers come from another planet.' This official quoted scientists as saying a flying ship of this type could not possibly have been constructed on Earth. The British government, I

Did Jackie Gleason view UFO bodies?

NEW YORK - The clamorous cry "To the moon. ALice" frequently delivered on the "Honeymooners" by the late, great Jackie Gleason, may have been inspired in part by the comic's fascination with outer space.

Gleason was an avowed believer in UFOs and, according to his ex-wife Beverly McKittrick, he even got involved in some spaced-out exploits with his friend Richard Nixon.

Beverly was 37-year-old divorcee with a great golf game when Jackie met her at Miami country club. Their four year marriage ended in 1974

In her unpublished biography of the funnyman entitled "The Great One," Beverly, Gleason's second spouse, describes a bizarre trip Jackie took with the then President in 1973 to Homestead AFB in Florida to see what she says were bodies of four dead space aliens recovered by the Air Force.

The aliens were supposedly embalmed and displayed on operating tables and classified as top-secret material. Gleason and Nixon visited the base under extremely tight security, she says.

"The significance of the information is tremendous," said Mike Luckman, director of the UFO research Center in New York. "The four bodies that Gleason saw were probably the same ones the Army recovered in 1947 at Roswell, N.M. We want to establish that link."

Gleason had a lifelong interest in the supernatural and accumulated one of the largest private libraries of esoteric and psychic literature in the country.

He even named his Peekskill N.Y. home "The Mothership" and had architects build everything in the round to resemble a flying saucer.

Said Luckman: "Most of the furniture was circular. So was the garage, which he called the Scout Ship."

learned, is withholding an official report on the 'flying saucer' examination at this time, possibly because it does not wish to frighten the public. In the United States, all kinds of explanations have been advanced. But no responsible official of the U.S. Air Force has yet intimated the mysterious flying ships actually vaulted from outer space."

Considerable support for Kilgallen's story came during that same period, when British Air Chief Marshal Lord Dowding, commander in chief of RAF fighters during the Battle of Britain, told the *London Sunday Dispatch* knowingly, "I am convinced that these objects [UFOs] do exist and that they are not manufactured by any nation on Earth. . . . I think that we must resist the tendency to assume that they all come from the same planet, or that they are actuated by similar motives. It might be that the visitors from one planet wished to help us in our evolution from the basis of a higher level to which they had attained. Another planet might send an expedition to ascertain what have been those terrible explosions which they have observed, and to prevent us from discommoding other people besides ourselves by the new toys with which we are so light-heartedly playing. Other visitors might have come bent solely on scientific discovery and might regard us with the dispassionate aloofness which we might regard insects found beneath an upturned stone."

Not only do these accounts appear to provide some substantiation for the recovered saucers story, but recent government letters make it plain that Project Aquarius—the subject of the telex that started the whole document controversy—actually exists.

When a researcher sent a Freedom of Information request to the National Security Agency (NSA), Dennis Chadwick, chief of information policy, responded, "Please be advised that Project Aquarius does not deal with unidentified aerial objects." Chadwick added, "Since you indicate in your letter that you will not be paying the

\$15,000.00 fee to search for records pertaining to Aquarius, this response completes our action on your request." Undaunted, the researcher inquired further and on April 15, 1986, received this intriguing reply from Julia Wetzel, the NSA's director of policy: "The document located in response to your request as stated in your 7 March letter has been reviewed by the Agency as required by the FOIA and has been found to be currently and properly classified . . . and remains TOP SECRET. . . . The document is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. . . ." While confirming the existence of TOP SECRET Project Aquarius, the NSA gave no indication if it involved UFOs. Considering past government reliance on semantic ambiguity, some researchers believed the denial that the project concerned "unidentified aerial objects" left open the question of identified objects on the ground.

It was ironic that as the government's official line that UFOs simply don't exist hardened, such documentation as above along with official reports and anecdotes increased in both quality and quantity. Something definitely was going on, but the public would not find out what through official government channels.

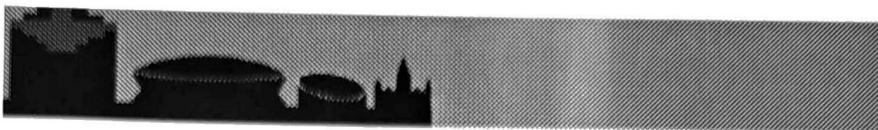

The nature of the relationship between Campbell and Mrs. Lincoln is not known.

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Executive Committee (ExComm)

A group of advisers known as the Executive Committee of the U.S. National Security Council was created by President Kennedy on October 16, the first day of the crisis (although it was not officially constituted until October 22). The Committee was the key decisionmaking body governing U.S. responses and actions during the crisis period. Statutory members included

State Dean Acheson; private advisers John McCloy and Robert Lovett; U.S. Ambassador to

the U.N. Adlai Stevenson; Deputy Director of the USIA Donald Wilson; Assistant Secretary

of State for Inter-American Affairs Edwin Martin; and, on the first day of the crisis, former

U.S. Ambassador to the Soviet Union Charles Bohlen. President Kennedy chaired the

Executive Committee.

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Sec. 457. - Operational files previously maintained by or concerning activities of National Photographic Interpretation Center: authority to withhold from public disclosure

(a) Authority. -

The Secretary of Defense may withhold from public disclosure operational files described in subsection (b) to the same extent that operational files may be withheld under section 701 of the National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 431).

(b) Covered Operational Files. -

The authority under subsection (a) applies to operational files in the possession of the National Imagery and Mapping Agency that -
