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E.W. - I might. At least I will keep your letter, will dig out my notes, and will contemplate answering. That the best I can say for now.

W.S. - Well, Dr. Walker, I will write a letter as soon as possible.  
Thanks for your valuable time.  
Good-bye.

E.W. - Good-bye.

The very next day, I wrote him a letter and inclosed a copy of the "MJ-12 Document". That was on Sept 1, 1987. During that telephone conversation, Dr. Walker verified one thing to me "The existence of MJ-12" (There has been a lot of debate, as of late, as to the redity of the 8 Page MJ-12 document and the Cutler Memo from the national archives in Washington D.C.).

If, Dr. Walker writes to me at all, and further more if he substantiates the 8 pages of MJ-12, we will have taken one more giant step forward. If he sends me xerox copies of his Wright Patterson

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Airforcebase meeting notes, then we will have taken several giant steps forward in our quest for the truth!! That is the reason for the extreme confidentiality on this matter between you and I - The fewer the people that know, at this sensitive stage of the investigation the better chance we have of obtaining the needed information.

Now as touching on your requests from me. ① The Arthur Bray letter that accompanier the Sept. 15, 1950 W.B. Smith - Sarbach interview notes, which he sent to me in April of 1983 doesn't say anything revealing, just wishing me luck in my research, and giving me the addresses of Muri Smith (Wilberts widow) and W. James Smith (Wilberts son - whom you have been in contact with) - both of which are now obsolete.
