

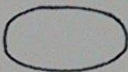
Irregular UFO Newsletter #1 (12 November 1974)

UFO Reports:

1) In the fall of 1969, Ms. Carol Frazer was walking home from school about 11 or 12 p.m. in downtown Toronto, Ontario. Her attention was drawn to an elongated oval or cigar-shaped whitish object which she estimates was at least as large as a full moon and was nearby. It emitted a throbbing, irregular hum. She watched it perhaps 30 seconds before running in the opposite direction.

2) About 2 or 3 a.m. on the morning of the 13th of October 1974, Richard Glade of Glenevis, Alberta (about 40 miles WNW of Edmonton) was awakened by the sound of his dog crying. He looked out the bedroom window to see a greenish light, circular in shape, and about 30 or 40 degrees above the horizon to the north. He awoke Ms. Carol Frazer, and the two of them watched as the light became more yellowish and began to pulsate. After perhaps 3 minutes the light faded away. They estimate it to have been perhaps a mile or so away, and to have been much larger than a star. No noise was heard. The land north of them is unpopulated.



3) About 10:45 p.m. on the evening of November 1st 1974, John Peltier was driving south along highway #2, four miles north of Morinville, Alberta (about 15 miles north of Edmonton). He noticed a bright orange-yellowish object come at great speed from the north-eastern sky at about a 45-degree angle. At first he thought it might be a meteor, and stopped the car to observe it better. But rather than fall to the ground, it stopped and hovered approximately 20 feet above the ground, and perhaps 100 feet away from his car. The object was circular and estimated to be 3 or 4 feet in diameter. Mr. Peltier continued to drive south along the highway. The object then paced his car - slowing down when he slowed down; and speeding up when he speeded up. When he turned the car east onto a secondary road the object lifted up, slowly at first, and then accelerated
