

The tests conducted by the U. of Manitoba made no mention mention of radium paint however did locate particles of uranium ore in the sample they had. Is it possible that radium paint flecks would register the maximum on a geiger counter scale? There would have to be a considerable amount of it to do this and you would think the University's tests here would have discovered it quite easily.

The second bit of information I developed was the fact that Sqd. Leader Bissky informed Michalak that the RCMP laboratory test~~s~~ on Michalak's burned under shirt was inconclusive. That is to say, they could not say what caused the burn on the shirt. Bissky stated this was most unusual in that it is normally possible to determine exactly what causes any burn through chemical analysis. This is the only bit of information on the government tests that has thus far leaked out.

Mr. Michalak, as you know, has been trying to secure some assistance from the Federal Government. He wrote the Prime Minister in an effort to procure a loan to finance his proposed trip south to a clinic. (We have since discouraged him from doing this until we receive further word from you) He was refused the loan and of course no finance company will loan him the money and his insurance company will not adjust his insurance nor is he insurable at all any more. Stewart Hunt of the Federal Health and Welfare Dept. at Ottawa, Ont. told Michalak that no assistance would be provided unless he was suffering from a fatal disease. According to Michalak, Hunt told him that it is quite possible that he could, in the future, contract leukemia. This is a significant statement to make and presumably Hunt said this because he believes Michalak received a dose of radiation poisoning.

What are the latest developments on Michalak's medical file? Are you planning to solicit funds for him in your next bulletin? Dr. S. B. Hrushovetz of the Winnipeg Clinic has recommended that Michalak have a skin biopsy on the burns but this is not covered by his medical. The cost - \$50.00 and possibly more if more tests are required. I think that we should wait until you receive a report from Dr. Dudley before proceeding with anything like this??

Since we can have a member of parliament take this matter further with the government, I would appreciate your advising if the test results have been received on the soil, shirt etc.

Ed Barker asked me to enquire on the present status of the foil strips sent to you Jan. 17, 1968. We thought these were quite interesting and would like to know what the tests revealed on this material.

Enclosed is the latest CAPRO bulletin. I'm not too pleased with it however we had lots of problems these past few months in absorbing CAPIC members into our group. The May issue~~s~~ will have some excellent reports on rectangular UFOs seen over Canada lately.
