Dear Sirs:

I was rather intrigued by a news report on a local Ottawa radio station (CFRA) recently, and I obtained a copy of their teletype report. It reads as follows:

"A number of unidentified objects from space have re-entered the atmosphere and fallen on the United States. This was revealed today in a letter to UN Secretary General U Thant from the US Ambassador, Charles W. Yost. Yost said the objects range in weight from 50 to 200 pounds, with the largest being 30 inches long, ten inches wide and five inches thick. The Ambassador told that as well that reports of other sightings are being investigated."

A key word in the second line is "re-entered" which implies that these objects are of terrestrial origin.

Do you happen to have any further information on this matter? If so, perhaps an article in the APRO Bulletin would be justified.
