Dear Ronald:

I must apologize for some delay in replying to your most interesting and welcome letters, for which many thanks, but I have been kept extremely busy over the past few months, not only with my office job but Topside and Club matters, and also throughout the summer, we have been entertaining a flow of Centennial visitors from England, other parts of Canada and the U.S.A., and unfortunately, I have got all behind with some of my correspondence. However, I very much appreciated your writing and I found all your news extremely interesting.

Thank you for sending your further subscription to Topside and I have extended your subscription in our records. It was interesting to note that you now have a registered group called The Montreal UFO Study Group of which you are Hon. Chairman - a well-deserved honour, as I know how much hard work and study you have put in on the fascinating subject of the UFO Mystery, and I wish you continued success in this field. It was also interesting to note that prior to the formation of your group, members spoke on radio and TV and had press interviews.

I was sorry to learn that you had been afflicted with Menieres Disease, necessitating a stay in hospital, and I sincerely hope that by now you have recovered from this distressing condition. Thank you very much for sending me copies of the 5 poems you wrote in hospital, which I found very beautiful and uplifting. They are full of sensitivity and understanding and a great love of the beauties of nature, and I hope to include some of them in future issues of Topside.

I was extremely interested to learn that as a result of your talk to the Human Fellowship group, pieces of the metal have been sent to McGill for analysis and that Professor John Jonas telephoned you stating that his group of scientists were "disturbed" at their findings, which is most revealing and interesting. I note Prof. Jonas requested further background information and that you gave him my name and address. To date, I have not heard from Prof. Jonas, but I note in your last letter, he had phoned you again, suggesting that we got in touch with Drs. Smith and McQueen of the Dept. of Energy, Mines & Resources, recommending that they carry out further tests and analysis on the metal. I followed up this suggestion by writing to Drs. Smith & McQueen, as per the enclosed copy of my letter to them of Sept. 27. To date, I have not received a reply from them, but will advise you of the results when I hear from them.

I note too, that another analysis was carried out by R. Chamberland, Dept. 7614 through your contact, Mr. W.S. Chipping, and we are most interested in the findings, conclusion, and also Mr. Chipping's comments. It is noted that Mr. Chamberland's report included a Metallographic Analysis, with photos, and if there is any possibility of your obtaining copies for us, we would greatly appreciate it. We would also like to know where the analysis was carried out and any other background information concerning it and trust that on Mr. Chipping's return from vacation, you will be able to get this data from him.
