Dear Dr. Schneider:

I am enclosing with this letter a copy of a recently published book written by a New Zealand airline pilot. The book is for eventual deposit in the National Science Library as a gift from myself.

Before depositing this book in the Library however, I am requesting that you arrange for a study of the book by N.R.C. scientists. It appears to me that the author may have made a major breakthrough in his particular field and so far scientists in other countries have not proved him to be wrong. Some, in fact, have apparently confirmed to him privately that he is correct.

The book is titled "Harmonic 695" and the primary author, Bruce Cathie, was assisted by Peter Temm. The book deals with the world-wide problem of Unidentified Flying Objects, and his breakthrough involves the relationship of nuclear explosions to a grid surrounding the Earth which is, according to Cathie, used by UFOs for various purposes, including propulsion.

As one who is recognized internationally for my own studies of the UFO problem over a great many years, and through my personal contacts and correspondence with various scientists who have looked deeply into the matter of UFOs, I can state that Cathie's evidence is most impressive. However, in view of the far-reaching implications of his findings and conclusions, scientifically, technologically, economically, militarily and in many other respects, I consider that it is vital to determine, right now, whether Cathie is right or wrong.
