Thank you for your letter and enclosure of Feb. 6th.

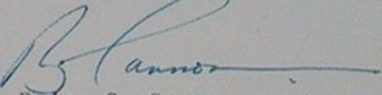
The Canadian Aerial Phenomena Research Organization (CAPRO) was organized last year primarily due to the increasing number of UFO sightings in Canada each year. CAPRO is the Canadian affiliate of the Aerial Phenomena Research Organization of Tucson, Ariz., however, while we are connected to APRO, we are operating as a separate group with our own executive, publication etc. The annual membership fee is \$3.00 and will provide you with a monthly news bulletin outlining as many of the major Canadian sightings as is feasible.

The photo in SS&S #50 was taken at the Atomic Energy installation at Piniwa, Man. this past summer. After our photo analyst examined the negatives and prints it was determined that the "object" was actually a chemical smear. It is very easy sometimes to be fooled and in this case we must admit we were. The actual print seemed to indicate a solid object with lights around the perimeter. We do nevertheless have other photos of UFOs and landing sites that are bonafide.

I am enclosing an application in the event you are interested in joining CAPRO. I would be most interested in receiving your book SCIENCE, THE PUBLIC AND THE UFO.
