Dear Mrs. Halford-Watkins:

It has been approximately six months since the issuance of the test results (Phase One) that were conducted on "Canadas Mystery Metal".

The attached test result information concludes the Two-Phase analysis program that was conducted by UFORAs Chemical and Metallurgical advisors and their assistants.

Judging from our test results, we cannot truthfully state that the metal is of an extraterrestrial origin. However, due to the circumstances surrounding the metal and the oddities in our findings, i.e., Chem Lab report - sufficient lack of Aluminum; Met. Lab - quote of Metallurgist - "One of the purest samples of this type of steel that I have ever come across" leads us to believe that this is truly no ordinary piece of metal. It should be noted here that the Metallurgy Lab conducts tests on the Austenitic-Manganese type steels quite frequently. Needless to say the lab was quite interested in this metal sample.
