10. The Truman Forrestal MEMORANDUM (IT IS NOT A LETTER--despite Klass' use of the term "letter" 8 times) is not another document. It is attachment A to the briefing. There is
11. again no evidence whatsoever that it is a forgery... probably prepared for Truman's signature by Forrestal and Bush during their meeting with each other prior to their joint meeting with Truman on Sept. 24, 1947.--the only date when the 3 of them met together during the last 8 months of 1947 (see enclosure). You were really taken on this one.
12. Naiveté is hardly the word to describe a decade of hard effort tens of thousands of miles of travel, thousands of dollars worth of phone calls and hundreds of hours at the Truman, and Eisenhower Libraries, the Library of Congress, the National Archives, the Harvard Archives, the Air Force Historical Archives, etc. As a physicist I have to look at evidence. I am not anxious to believe anything and have certainly demonstrated more objective and serious scepticism than has Mr. Klass. Having spoken at well over 500 colleges and to dozens of professional groups in 49 states and 8 provinces I think I am aware of most of the serious questions. I recognize that you would never know from Mr. Klass' release that I am a professional scientist though you would know about the Bermuda Triangle.
13. There is no evidence whatsoever that the MJ-12 papers are a fabrication. There is a great deal of evidence that the silly hoax claim by Klass is propaganda and that you have been taken in by it. I am sorry about that.

I hope that you will recognize the obligation to correct the completely erroneous impressions you have given the readers of the CSM who have come to trust your objectivity. This story is the story of the millenium and deserves at the very least FAIR and OBJECTIVE treatment even if your fellow member of the journalistic fraternity, Mr. Klass, has for whatever reason NOT provided that treatment.
