Dear Mr. Falk:

I am glad to hear you have enjoyed "The New Science". There are only about 20 copies left and it has gone all over the world. I don't know if we will reprint it, we will have to decide about that.

I have had some nasty letters regarding Wib's authority to continue his work under the Gov't. and I ignored them because the chap who stated outrage and very definitely that the government did not sanction his work, was a close friend of Wib's and had a very important job - now he has retired so he will not suffer - but the Deputy Minister of the Department, Mr. C.P. Edwards, wrote a letter to Wib giving him just that authority and I have the letter. Wib would not have wanted his reputation injured - so I did what I thought was the way Wib would ^{have} wanted it done - ignored because those that knew Wib personally had no doubts. Also they worked right in the lab with him - assisted in building the equipment - there wasn't any doubt in their minds. Wib rebuilt much of the equipment he used - spent his own money for parts - I realize that the Flying Saucer Review wanted the letter published but it was small potatoes to argue. Wib had many patents which the gov't. possesses, his equipment detected the explosion of the first atomic bomb and the Nat. Research Council arrived and took the whole thing inside hours and continued and rebuilt his design. He simply was so keen on developing devices to detect what was going on in the atmosphere - the potential that was there - that everyone who knew him became keenly interested too.

Dear Miss Smith,

I received your most recent letter, and naturally appreciate your taking time to write. I am very happy of your recent hospital stay. My sincere wishes that you enjoy many more years of retirement.

I rushed this letter to you to tell you in on a recent development that might prove that the work of the Ottawa people, and particularly the work done by Wilbert might not have been in vain.

As you already probably know Wilbert spoke at the Canadian Embassy with a Dr Robert E. Sarloach who told Wilbert of flying success was real & it was the most highly classified subject in the USA.

Wilbert then had some sort of session with Dr. Vernon Bush at the US Research and Development Board. What and how much was discussed I still don't know.

Shortly before Dr. Robert Sarloach's unfortunate death in 1986, Dr. Sarloach gave details of a series of meetings at Wright Patterson Air Force Base where the topic was "Cracked Egg Success and the Hummed Ladies." These meetings took place in 1949-1950.

Dr. Sarloach wasn't at the meetings, and the information was Wilbert was only what others at the meetings had told.

Most importantly Dr. Sarloach gave details sufficient to Dr. Eric Arthur Walker who Sarloach stated had led all of the meetings. Dr. Walker was the Executive

Secretary with the Research and Development Board in 1950-1951, the same time period Wilbert talked with Dr. Sarloach.

I have enclosed for your interest the first interview done with Dr. Walker Aug 31, 1987. One note: M2-12 refused to be in the interview as they stated 12 the long rumored 12 man committee headed by Dr. Bush that controlled all research.

I have spent hundreds of hours searching Dr. Walker and have a person state director who lives several miles from Walker ready to conduct a face-to-face interview. Hopefully we will obtain the notes referred to.

Having followed the work of Wilbert and the Ottawa researchers I believe I am now closer than any other researcher to proving Wilbert was right all along.

Time will tell.

Dear Mrs. Smith,

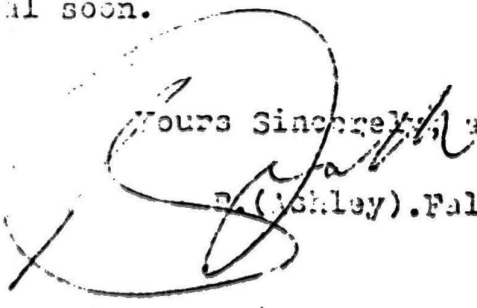
