Dear Mr. Vonkeviczky,

In reply to your letter dated July 29, 1968, I have the honour to inform you that the Royal Government of Cambodia has carefully examined your proposition concerning the formation, within the United Nations, of an International Institute for research and study on Unidentified Flying Objects.

The Royal Government of Cambodia is extremely sorry for not being able to consider the possibility of bringing your above mentioned proposal to either the United Nations Conference on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space, the Security Council, or other agencies connected with the United Nations, being of the opinion that it belongs essentially to the industrialized big powers to take such an initiative.

As you are well aware, Cambodia is a very poor country and will not be able to offer either money or equipment for the research and study Institute in question.

However, the Royal Government is willing to offer wide lands for the construction of headquarters of the Institute and of other observation buildings, and to grant all the guarantees of non-nationalization as well as certain immunities and privileges consistent with the international practice on the matter, to persons who will be sent by the United Nations.
