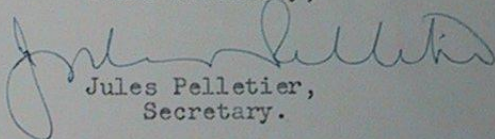
Dear Mr. Bray:

Further to my letter of December 15th, I am now in a position to reply to your inquiries.

In 1952, when reported sightings of unidentified flying objects became numerous, a Canadian government committee was established to collect information. The committee was disbanded in 1954 when it appeared that the vast majority of reported sightings could be explained by known phenomena. Since then, there has been no direct Canadian government interest in the matter.

We understand, however, there is a non-government organization in Washington, D.C., known as the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena which maintains an interest in this subject. The Committee's address is 1536 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington 6, D.C. The Director is Major Donald E. Kehoe, USMC (Ret.).
