

MARCH 19, 2008 TRANSCRIPTION INTERVIEW WITH BILL HOLDEN RE HIS
CONVERSATION WITH JFK

- I hope everything going good.

- I'm feeling better. I was very sick.
- When we talked it must have been before you got sick. At that time you were doing some business meetings. Here's my question. Another researcher brought it up to me. There's an article by Jim Marrs from the yr 2000 and Jim Marrs quotes you as follows with regard to your conversation with Kennedy. He said Bill Holden told me Kennedy said to me, 'I'd like to tell the public about the ufo situation but *my hands are tied*.'
- Right.
- When I looked at your interview with Project Camelot I don't have it in front of me but as I recall you said there that Kennedy asked you, 'Well Airman Holden what's your views on ufo?' and you said 'Well Mr. President I wouldn't want to say' and then he said 'Go ahead.'
- No no no that's not what I said. What it was there was a newspaper that was sitting in front of President Kennedy, two of them in fact, one was a local Visboten paper and the other was one of the local English printed papers, and it showed a pic of 3 ufos right off the autobahn. And uh the uh the uh well what do you think? And I asked him says Well what do you think sir? And then my comment was, uh, that with that wonderful warm smile of his, he uh said I asked you first.
- Right that's what you said on Camelot.
- Right, then I went ahead and gave him my answer.
- Right and you said something of, g'head. What did you say to him? You said something approximating, Uh I think they're not from here.
- What I told him basically was that I was the grandson of a Methodist minister raised in south Georgia. And for me to believe that we are the only uh intelligent beings in all of god's creations, no, I can't believe that. So yes I do believe that ufo and et phenomenon.
- Yes, and then he said—
- That was our conversation.
- Did he say anything back to you?

- No. Oh, wait a minute! His comment back to me was uh lemmie see and I'm trying to—
- It's been a long time, Bill.
- Yes, tell me about it. I'm trying to remember. It was like uh, uh, I'd have to look back in my notes and everything as far as what he said there. Because I always, when I sit down to do an interview I always preview go back thru all of my notes and everything so all my interviews are consistent.
- Yes, that makes a lot of sense to me.
- But anyway, in short, was he says "It's very true. It's very real." And, uh, but as far as he never said anything, as far as Jim Marrs' interview and everything and writing, he took some liberties as far as to what he wrote in his. His report. Some of it was correct, some of it was not correct. But as far as the, I know this, that one of the reasons Kennedy was assassinated was because he did want to let the public know about the ufos and the ets.
- How do you know that Bill?
- Uh, there are a number of things, research I've done on Kennedy as far as to how did he die? Who shot him? Uh, it's just like this as far as, uh, what's the color of the casket that's leaving, that he's in, supposedly, that he's leaving, uh, uh, general hospital there in Dallas, uh, it's silver. Ok? Gun-metal grey. What's the color of the casket he supposedly brought off the airplane? It's copper-clad, not even the same casket. The casket that came out of the hospital was taken out into the Pacific and dropped into one of the deepest, uh, out there in the, canyons in the Pacific, on a C-130.
- Is that right?
- Yeah
- So you think there was monkey business with that?

I am humoring him here regarding Kennedy's death. On my previous two interviews with Holden, he flew into absolute rages almost yelling, "I don't speculate!!" Each time these rages were in connection with questions about his personal experiences. In the meantime, I noticed from the Camelot interview he speculates wildly when he feels like it. About the rages, I don't hold them against him; I think he was under quite a bit of stress with some business he was doing at the two times I previously called him. About the questions I asked him that caused the rages, they were fairly mundane, things like When you were standing at the bus, how did you know you were supposed to stay at the bus and not walk over to the UFO and the aliens? Or, what did the other service men you were with say when you all saw the ufo? I'm not quoting myself now, just trying to give

you the flavor of what caused what I see as Irrational rages over mundane questions. Grant, did I already send you the transcriptions of those interviews? If I didn't, do you want them. I recall being rather intimidated by his rages in the previous two interviews.

In the meantime, as I say, he speculates wildly about things he knows nothing about. Here he has said, quite blandly, Kennedy was killed because of the ufo secret. How do you know that? I ask. He tells me about the caskets.

- Well, the thing is just like this. Kennedy did not die on the 22nd of November 1963. He supposedly died in March of 1964 at Bethesda Hospital.
- So you think he was kept alive there in the hospital?
- Yeah the thing is it's just like this. He was not shot from the back like everybody said. If he had been hit by a 7 mm Mauser from the back of the head, his entire front of his head would have been blown off. Ok? The shot entered the lowest chin and exited through the right rear quadrant of his back of his skull. And it was a small caliber round. It was not a 7 mm Mauser round. It's just like why do, why does the Mafia use 22s to shoot somebody in the head? [laughs] Cause it runs round inside the brain and scrambles it. It doesn't exit.
- Bill, so, uh, this statement that Jim Marrs attributes to you, with the phrase "my hands are tied," is not anything Kennedy said to you?
- [sighs] To, I, ok, I won't, won't, ya know, without going back through my notes and everything I won't say yes or no at this time.
- Alright.
- But I know that he was very uh, I know it was a subject that was very important to him, and I know that if I had known more then, I would have absolutely just grilled him endlessly.
- Yes, yes. Would you like the article in which Jim Marrs says that I got an email from Jim Marrs because—
- Would you please?
- Yeah I wrote to Jim Mars

He was not making reservations for Dublin. Major Orthman was flying, but when he called in later he said that you told him that State was not making the arrangements for the crew or words to that effect. I called Mr. Blevins and he said that it was his understanding that Mr. McNally was taking care of the reservations for the passengers for Dublin-(Mr. McNally does not have a copy of the crew members).

Blevins sent out a wire yesterday re the other passengers.

Hank: Per conversation 3 May with Mr. McNally: he has made reservations in Dublin for the PASSENGERS and will now send an additional message making reservations in Dublin for the CREW. He will get in touch with State Department and have State make all additional reservations (BONN, FRANKFURT) for BOTH PASSENGER AND CREW LISTS.

Please advise Major Orthman of this for me.
