SUBJECT: Report of Information on Unconventional Aircraft.

1. One object; unusually bright and a brilliant white; appeared to be three or four times, as large as a star; as object ascended it appeared to change in color to a hazy yellow - green - red and left tail of light behind; no sound; appeared to have tremendous rate of speed, as well as a pattern of flight, although it would zig zag in an abrupt fashion. Observer stated object did not appear to be conventional aircraft and in his judgment displayed convincing traits of planned maneuverability, which discounted theory of its being a balloon.
2. Observation made on 12 January 1951, approximately 2200 EST.
3. Visual sighting on corner of X and D Streets, Stewart Air Force Base, New York. Location of observation point on hill of approximately 100 feet altitude.
4. Observer was 2d Lt. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~, USAF, Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, Stewart Air Force Base, New York. No previous aerial observer experience.
5. Visibility excellent; ceiling high thin scattered clouds.
6. Observer stated on 11 January 1951 at approximately the same time, he noticed this brilliant object in same general position, but was in sight only several seconds before it descended and was blocked from view.

SUBJECT: Report of Information on Unconventional Aircraft.

1. One object.
2. Size undetermined; white light resembling very bright star; round in shape, no tail or exhaust seen; speed was rapid upward vertical motion with an erratic sidewise motion. Upward speed was not constant; faded from sight through very high scattered clouds; no sound.
3. Object sighted 12 January, 2205 EST.
4. Visual sighting.
5. Observer on hill approximately 100 feet elevation first observed object from car. Stopped on corner of X and D Streets, Stewart Air Force Base, New York and observed object for approximately 2 minutes from outside of car. Direction of object from point of observation approximately 120°. Distance unknown; altitude from approximately 100 feet above horizon to very high ceiling.
6. Observed by ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~, ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ USAF, Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, Stewart Air Force Base, New York. No aerial observer experience.
7. Visibility excellent; ceiling high thin scattered clouds.
8. No weather balloons released during period of observation; no local aircraft taking off or landing.
