As they got past us we could see they were traveling rapidly. There wasn't a cloud in the sky and they shown like jewels silver in color although with a bright sun shining they might have been other color. There was neither smoke, flash, or sound of motors. In five minutes they were out of sight. We could not determine size or altitude. They were sparkling globes.
