1. Bell-shaped pear object, large at top, small at bottom seen at estimated distance of 15-20 miles. Color - shiny silver or burnished gold. Aerodynamically resembled tear drop. No trail, exhaust, maneuvers, sound, or propulsion observed. Seemed to remain stationary for period of one hour and disappeared when sun went down.

2. ⁷1730 MST, 20 March 52. Observed for one hour.

3. Visual observation from ground with 6 x 30 binoculars.

4. Object observed SW of Clovis AFB at altitude of 5,000', distance 15-20 miles. Distance far enough so 8 x 30 binoculars failed to bring object clearly in view.

5. Observed by [REDACTED] age 37, Vision 20-20, Pilot.

6. Weather - Clear for 12 miles, wind SW at 23 mph. No clouds.

7. Weather balloon released from White Sands 1400 hours same day.

Possible with prevailing winds in upper air at 50 mph could have been same.

White Sands approximately 200 miles SW Clovis AFB.
