An unidentified aerial object was observed at Rabat, French Morocco 9 September 1952 and reported by electrical means (see reference) 10 September 1952.

COMMENTS of the Preparing Officer:

1. The Preparing Officer interviewed the source, [REDACTED], at 0830 hours, 10 September 1952.
2. [REDACTED], civilian, DAF, is assigned to the Directorate of Intelligence, Headquarters, 5th Air Division, as an [REDACTED]. In addition to his experience as an [REDACTED] source stated that he was assigned auxiliary duties (directed aircraft to parking areas) on Naval aircraft carrier for 2 1/2 years.
3. French Civil Air Control (MATO), located at Gages Airdrome, Casablanca reported no aircraft in area of sighting.
4. The French Weather Station, located at Gages Airdrome, Casablanca reported 3/8 alto cumulus to 9000 feet, very light surface winds south southeast 2 to 5 knots, visibility very good to 20 kilometers.
5. Inclosed are two (2) illustrations prepared by the source showing the approximate form of the object observed and a sketch indicating the area of sighting and path of object.
6. The geographic coordinates of Rabat are 34° 2' N - 06° 52' W.

AIR INTELLIGENCE INFORMATION REPORT

The following report was given to the Preparing Officer by [REDACTED] Civilian DAF [REDACTED] at Headquarters, 5th Air Division 10 September 1952.

Unidentified aerial object (see illustration) was observed at [REDACTED] Babas, the residence of source, between 2100 and 2110Z, 9 September 1952. Source stated that a soundless, disc-shaped object heading northwest turning west to southwest was observed for a period of approximately 5 seconds. Object appeared with 8 white lights in an evenly spread formation. During the observation, there was no break in formation and lights appeared to be enveloped with mist or fog. The altitude of object was undeterminable; however, the speed was estimated to be twice the apparent speed of a T-33 jet trainer.
