1. Flying Tiger A/C 984, Southeast bound at 12000 feet, reported sighting strange stationary light in sky, estimated 15000 feet, changing color. Aircraft was on heading of 120 degrees. Object was directly off nose of aircraft at 11 o'clock. Location of sighting was East of Boise at approximately 0200 hours, 25 September 1952.

2. At 0220 hours, Boise Radio sighted same object on a bearing of 100 degrees from the station. Object appeared to move from side to side and up and down.

3. No additional information available.
