There was no report of a crash. It is probably birds in formation. Thirteen round tan colored objects were observed traveling two abreast. Objects were sighted at an elevation of 45 deg, azimuth of 45 deg. Source stated that he observed a dark streak on the left side of the formation. Object disappeared behind clouds after 4 seconds observation.

Capt. Theodoros J. Caracalas, Master of the Panamanian SS. *Thekla*, reports that on a voyage from Europe toward Korea on October 12, 1953, at 0020 (ship's time) he sighted Minikoi Island Light (Intl. No. F0758) (approximate position $8^{\circ}16' N.$, $73^{\circ}01' E.$) at a distance of approximately 60 miles.

Weather overcast, wind easterly force 2 to 3.
