SPOT INTELLIGENCE REPORT

SUBJECT: Unidentified Flying Object at
Muskogee, Oklahoma

TO: Director, Special Investigations
Headquarters USAF
Washington 25, D. C.

1. SUMMARY: Mr. [REDACTED] Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma, advised that at approximately 1400 hours, sometime during the summer of 1953, he took a photograph of an unidentified flying object which appeared in the sky on the eastern outskirts of Muskogee, Oklahoma.

2. DETAILS: Mr. [REDACTED] residence as shown, who is employed by the Post Office Department, Tulsa, Oklahoma, reported to the 11th District Office of Special Investigations Detachment Commander, Tulsa, Oklahoma, that he had been to lunch and was walking near the restaurant (name unknown) in Muskogee, Oklahoma, when he saw an object glinting in the sun. He had in his possession a Super Ikonta type camera and took a picture of the object, which was estimated to be traveling at a speed of 300 to 500 miles per hour and was at an altitude of approximately 6000 to 7000 feet. Mr. [REDACTED] described the object as being approximately 75 to 80 feet in diameter, traveling on a horizontal plane, noiseless, and traveling in a southern direction. [REDACTED] advised that he had been reluctant to report this incident for fear of becoming involved.

Mr. [REDACTED] described the day as being bright and sunny, with a few white clouds in the sky. He had a shutter speed of 1/500 of a second and an F stop of 2.8 on the camera. Mr. [REDACTED] further advised that the object was only in his view for a few seconds.

The original negative furnished by the informant has been reproduced at this District and is the inclosure, the original having been returned to Mr. [REDACTED] per his request. [REDACTED] did state that the negative had been secured from Eastman Kodak Company, Rochester, New York.
