Am., a stripe of startling, brilliant
green unfurled from at my right to-
ward the left with three bursts (it un-
furled a certain distance, stopped momen-
tarily, continued in an arc, stopped
for another infinitesimal instant, then
another burst in the same uninter-
rupted arc — at the end of which ap-
peared this spinning, crazily whirl-
ing white-yellow disc like the musci-
cal tops you can buy at Read's Drug-
stores everywhere. At its circumference,
a narrow strip of red was seen. From
this spinning object, the size of a hand-
bain, on either side of the green ribbon,
red and orange fire in broad streams
whooshed; and sparks flew. Suddenly the
disc flipped over; there was a sudden

even though it seemed to dip about 3 yds. at times. This went on for approximately 25 min. I had a daughter take a look at the sky there, not telling her what it was I wanted her to see. She also saw this moving object, just as I saw it.

About 3:50 Am., where we had before ^{at times} noticed a certain star (?) bounce and sway like a pendulum, in the Eastern sky, there came, I guess the same star; it moved forward, changed from white to orange to red, then receded and disappeared. A tiny, pin-point of red seemed to follow its wake, at the left of it, and very close to it. Each time the stars and that part of the sky were blotted out, with the disappearance of these objects. the round object had been was a black void. All around that were somewhat lazily floating white puffs of smoke. Then, nothing! It all took about a half-minute or so. It was warm and still outside. A glow as of a pre-dawn midsummer morning hung on the horizon in the general direction where this phenomenon (?) disappeared. An hour and a half later, the temperature outside was 63°C .

I have been advised that this occurred in the Southern sky ^{starting} from west to the east.

At about 3:00 Am. or so, in the Western sky, there was this round, white, blurred, size of a large hand, object which dipped up and down, side to side, slowly, moving constantly, but always coming back to the same spot,

may consider me "crazy", so to speak, and who knows, maybe they would be right.

Yet, sometimes, though these things are not exciting to us anymore, as we had begun occasionally, to see these things about two summers ago, then this summer, and this fall, and winter, I have had these moving stars brought to my attention by my daughter, who is seventeen, or my other two children, nine and almost thirteen. Invariably, they pull down the blinds more securely, and usually go to sleep, even if it's early, so they can forget about them, because they feel somewhat uneasy. I don't. I'll even go outside, to get a better view; only sometimes, you'd think that I was the one upon whom a camera was being trained, and was being scrutinized, and not the other way around.

So, I have decided to put this all in writing, forget about it, and don't worry whether there are any more go-gos

similar glow of light, like right before the colors of the sunrise appear, and everything is silhouetted against it.

Too bad, someone can't come out here, and watch, and see, especially, those shimmering, color-changing, slowly swinging, sometimes bouncing, dipping and gliding what-nots that we see at times. I wish someone could tell me, that they are what I see, or tell me that I am a victim of hallucinations; because why such activity in the skies — usually from 1:00 A.M. to 4:00 A.M. — though sometimes they begin earlier.

This past week, in the southern sky, again, I saw a color-changing star; it seemed to come lower to earth than before. Once there was a muted, glow like a sunburst right below it, which for an instant lit up the dark area and flashing, disappeared.

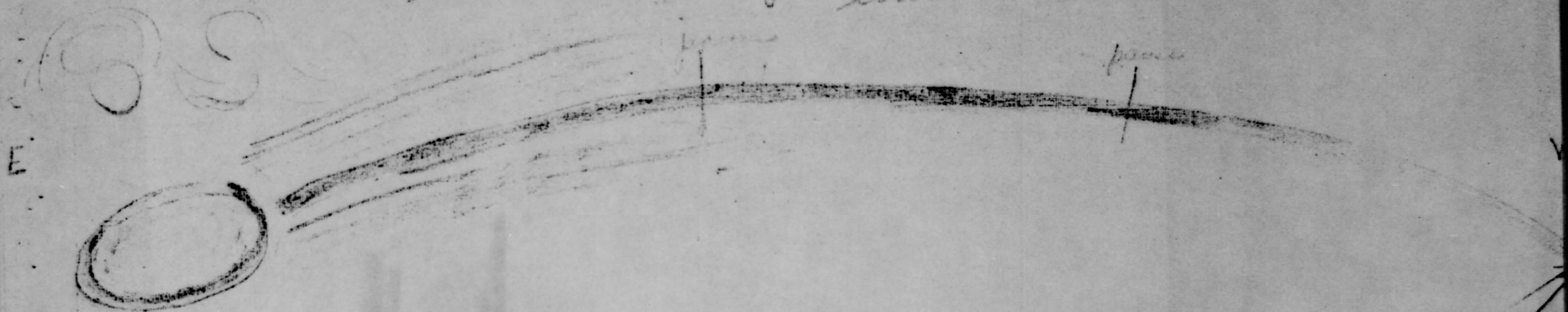
I hate to write about this, about people
