11. Position title of preparing officer is Wing Training and Operations Officer. Observer is a Senior Pilot on flying status and has over 17 years in the Air Force. This is Observer's first sighting of UFO. There was some meteorological activity in this night, and also at time of sighting there was a football game in progress approximately 200 yards south-east of observer. It appeared that the lights from this game reflected on the bottom surface of object giving it a grayish color as it passed over, and also led observer to believe that the altitude of object was not over 1,500 ft.

12. Additional Data

- a. Estimated speed: 200 mph
- b. Distance from Observer to object approximately 1,000 to 1,500 feet.
- c. Object heading was on approximately a course of 240 degrees.

I. SOURCE: GRAVES E. MYERS, Lt. Col., USAF

II. REMARKS: SOURCE was a friendly, sincere, and above average intelligent person. He has had varied experience in the Air Force, and is well versed in the field of flying and identification of aircraft. He seemed very eager and willing to cooperate, and answered all questions in a straight forward manner. As this was the SOURCE's first sighting, he was very much interested in this matter. It is the opinion of the investigators that Col. Myers was an excellent source of information.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF OBJECT:

1. At 16/0237Z Oct 54, SOURCE stepped into back yard of residence located at 902 W. Iowa St., Okla. (EDGEMORE PARK 0525) and suddenly noticed a strange object moving at approximately 200 mph at an altitude of 1500 feet. SOURCE stated that he observed this object for approximately 5 seconds, at which time it disappeared over the roof of a neighboring home. SOURCE stated that the area around his residence was illuminated by stadium lights from a football game which was in progress 100 yards S.E. SOURCE stated that the object flew through this lighted area and appeared to be grayish white in color. The objects were oval shaped, smooth and symmetrical. Light from the football field reflected on the underside of the object. Object was about the size of a grapefruit held at arms length.

2. The night was dark, as the moon had not yet risen. The weather was clear and cool.

3. The object did not change course at any time while in sight of SOURCE.

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4. SOURCE stated definitely that there was an absence of sound, and that there was no contact or flames of any kind.

5. SOURCE stated that he definitely had not the remotest idea of what this object could be. Upon losing sight of the object, he immediately went into his house, and drew a sketch of the object. Reference Incl #2, Rept 20 000000Z SOURCE's Memory Sketch of Object.

SOURCE, who was very much interested in sighting this strange object, and also familiar with AF 210-2, immediately checked with the Storm Warning Radar at Vance AFB. They informed him that no strange objects had been sighted. The next morning, SOURCE contacted the local astronomer, who told him there was some meteorological activity in that area at time of sighting. SOURCE stated that he had sighted a meteorite approximately 15 minutes after sighting the strange object. He also stated that he checked with Vance AFB Control Tower. At 16/0200Z Oct 57, a B-25 departed Vance AFB South Base, and at 16/0235Z Oct 57, a B-25 departed from Vance AFB East Base. He also checked with Weather Detachment 16-1, to see if any balloons were aloft at time of sighting with negative response.

17. INVESTIGATOR'S SUMMARY: It is the opinion of the investigator that SOURCE was very familiar with aircraft, especially at such a low altitude, and it is not very probable that object could have been an aircraft. As there were no other observers, and the object was sighted for only approximately five seconds, the preparing officer can advance no theory as to the identity of the object.

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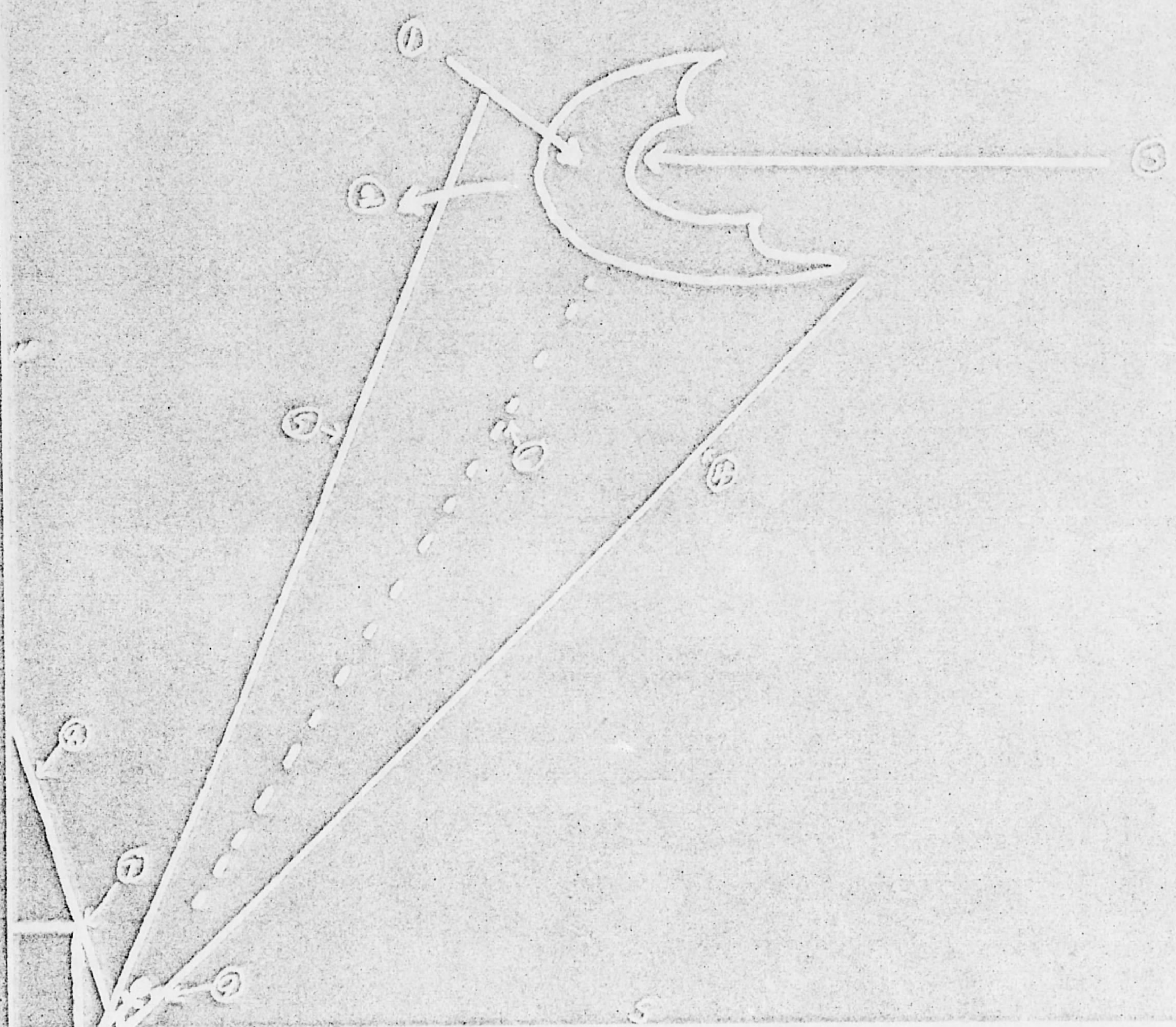
