3. SOURCE described a change in shape of the object as follows: "As I stated, it changed its direction from diagonal to horizontal. This being perceptible only when the object was at a distance of only a change of direction of the long axis of the object from diagonal to horizontal. This change of direction was taking place, there was also a change of shape taking place from a relatively long thin line to a shorter, fatter shape that was thicker in the middle than at the ends. A couple of minutes passed over the object during this observation. After eight minutes (by my watch) the north end of the shape began to bend down. The whole shape did not tilt, it bent. By continuing this bending the shape reversed itself completely so that now had been the north end was now the south end. It took an estimated thirty (30) to sixty (60) seconds to complete this unorthodox maneuver. A sketch is contained as Incl. 1. The object changed color from an intense white to gray and finally to red. A dark tip appeared on the original north end of the object and remained visible through 20 degrees of horizontal distance before the object disappeared. It took from three (3) to three and one half (3 1/2) minutes to travel this 20 degree arc.
