THE CIVILIAN POSIT OF THE TWO OBSERVERS AS CONTRIBUTING WRITERS TO THE PERIODICALS TIME AND LIFE, AND THE AF DESIRE TO MAINTAIN THE BEST POSSIBLE RELATIONS WITH THESE AGENCIES MAKES IT NEC TO RECM THAT CONSIDERATION BE GIVEN TO CONDUCTING A MORE THOROUGH INVESTIGATION BY THE 4602D AISS.
