2. THE REPORTER STATED THAT HE HAD OBSERVED THE OBJECT
FLYING IN A SOUTHWEST DIRECTION AT AN ALTITUDE OF APPROXIMATELY
10,000 FEET.

3. THE OBJECT WAS DESCRIBED AS BEING SHAPED LIKE A
DISC AND HAD A BRIGHT WHITE GLOW.

4. THE REPORTER STATED THAT HE HAD OBSERVED THE OBJECT
FOR A PERIOD OF APPROXIMATELY 10 SECONDS.
