10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Pilot of AF 783 a T-33 Westover to Harmon rptd. fol. incdt. to Chatham RCAF sta. Pos. rpt.: HKLB 5505 at 0802Z obs. a large round mass flashing white and blue light 4 dgs. to the right of his A/C and 2 dgs. above the horizon. It appeared to be reflecting light and to be similar to a mass of burning gasses. It was not the sun or an A/C. He estimated the object to be 15 miles in his 12 o'clock pos., but failed to gain on it. at 0806Z it was 6dgs. above the horizon and at 0818Z it was 8 dgs above the horizon.
