2. It is requested that these questionnaires be completed as thoroughly and accurately as possible by these observers.

3. The completed questionnaires are to be forwarded to this headquarters, where they will be used as an aid in further investigation and evaluation of the reported sighting.

4. This headquarters is particularly interested in the possibility of electrical vortices at the time of sighting. It is requested that the following information be forwarded this headquarters with the completed forms mentioned above:

- a. Type terrain at the area of sighting.
- b. Type soil at the area of sighting.
- c. Any known vortices at the approximate time of sighting.
- d. Are vortices known in the area of the UFOB sighting?

5. Expedition of this matter would be greatly appreciated by this headquarters.

2. Further inquiries concerning the reliability of A/2C Carlos
Hernandez, observer who reported referenced sighting, revealed that
subject airman is of a very unstable nature and on previous occasions
he reported seeing other objects which never existed.

3. Therefore, it is requested that AIIR No. 1-55 be removed
from your files, destroyed, and disregarded completely. In the
future persons reporting Unidentified Flying Objects to this Head-
quarters will be checked for reliability and character before a
formal report is submitted, thus eliminating the possibility of
imaginary sightings.

4. In view of the foregoing, US Air Force Technical Informa-
tion Sheets, Form A, are not being completed as requested in para-
graph 1, basic letter. They have been withdrawn, however, for future
reference in this Command.
