Pilot from local FIS Squadron made repeated passes over location and though he appeared to pass thru the object he noted nothing. Binoculars used by observers.				11. COMMENTS Preparing officer suggests moon thru clouds could have caused sighting. Air Almanac discounts this--moon was low in the east at time of sighting. Almanac also discloses that at time of sighting Saturn was at an altitude of 30°, and in the SW, the area of sighting. Possibly the observers saw Saturn thru haze and clouds. Binoculars could account for the colors and size.
