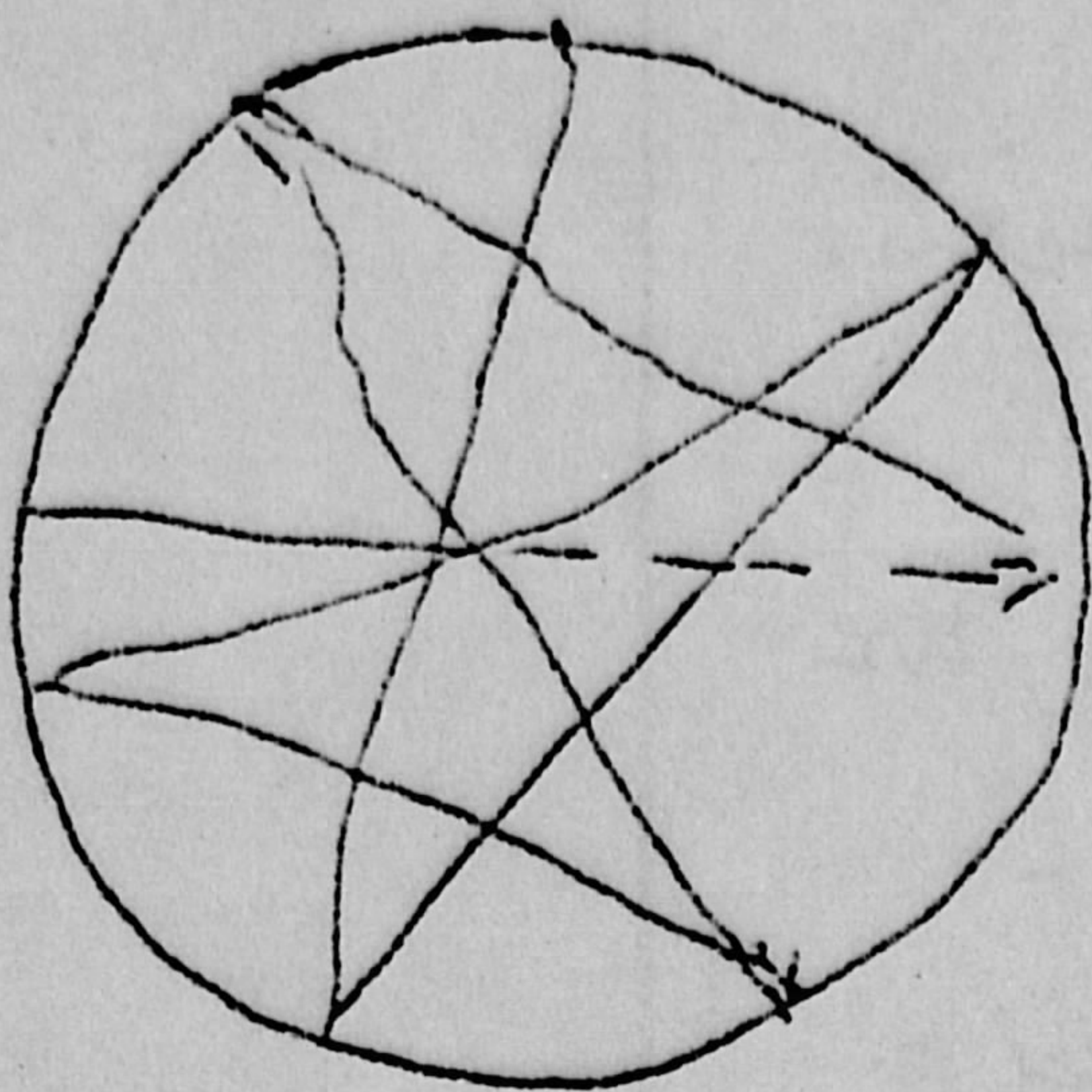

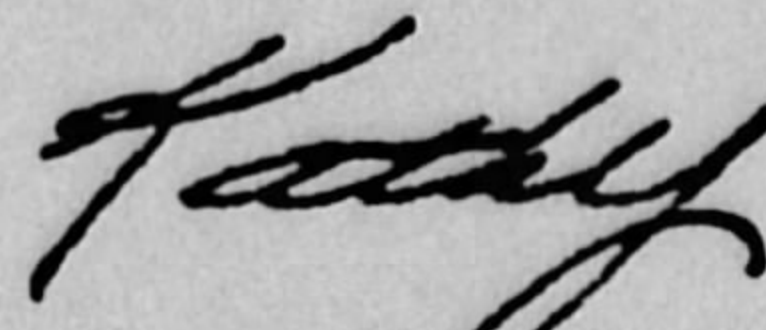
Dear Major:
